

UUCF Schedules Three–Day President's Cup Golf Tournament at PGA National in Palm Beach Gardens

ome and enjoy three wonderful days and two nights at the PGA National in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida on October 2-4. You will enjoy three fun-filled days of golfing on three different 18 hole courses. Participants will have the opportunity to play on the Haig Course on Friday, the Champion course on Saturday and the Squire course on Sunday. A different tournament will be held on each course. The format will be a two-man scramble, two-man best ball and twoman alternate shot. All tournaments will be handicapped so everyone will have an equal opportunity to win.

Mike Woodall with John Woody, Inc. is chairing this year's tournament. All proceeds from this year's tournament will benefit the UUCF Legal Defense Fund.

Designed by Tom Fazio, the Haig Course was the first to open for play at PGA National Resort & Spa. Fazio's goal in designing this spectacular choice among Palm Beach golf clubs was to create an outstanding quality course that would be playable for all types of golfers. The major design factor relates to the location of water hazards. There are no crossing water hazards — which means the golfer always has the option of playing around a water hazard rather than over it. This eliminates a major obstacle for the high handicap golfer. At 6,806 yards, the Haig is the second-longest course at PGA National and has the highest difficulty rating from the standard men's (white) and ladies' (red) tees. Our Palm Beach golf resort requires a combination of length and accuracy off the tee to set up your approach to these tricky greens. Both the 9th and

18th holes return to the clubhouse area . . . allowing play to start from the 1st and 10th tees, making the Haig Course a convenient choice for 9-hole play in the afternoon.

The 1st, 8th, and 9th holes surround the Haig Driving Range — which has several practice greens, bunkers and chipping areas. The Haig Range is also the location of one of the nation's most comprehensive golf schools: the Golf Digest Academy.

The Haig Course was named in honor of Walter Hagen, known affectionately as "The Haig." Hagen became an international legend through his unparalleled style and his accomplishments in golf, including five PGA Championships.

Originally designed by Tom Fazio for major tournament play, the Champion Course at PGA National Resort & Spa was redesigned by Jack Nicklaus in 1990. Although the Champion Course has generous landing areas and spacious and accepting greens, golfers are presented with course management challenges throughout their rounds. This South Florida golf resort course has five sets of teeing areas, so golfers can choose the yardage that best accommodates their playing abilities. This makes the course





enjoyable for golfers of all skill levels. The first hole runs along the adjoining driving range, with a practice green located next to the first tee for that last—minute warm up. The 15th, 16th and 17th holes of our South Florida golf course — which, along with the 11th hole, have been designated as "The Bear Trap" by Nicklaus — statistically have all been among The Top 10 Most Difficult Holes on the Senior PGA Tour. In May 2008, USA Today stated that The Bear Trap is "one of the toughest stretches in golf."

The Champion Golf Course has a distinguished place in Major Championship history. It was the site of the 1983 Ryder Cup Matches; the 1987 PGA Championship; the 1982-2000 PGA Seniors' Championships; and the 1981, 1982, and 1994–2000 PGA Junior Championships. PGA National's Champion Course is now home to the PGA Tour's Honda Classic.

The Champion Course is dedicated to Jack Nicklaus, in honor of a man whose commitment to golf has been an inspiration to the game, and personifies the high standard of excellence we associate with the "Player of the Century."

Designed by Tom Fazio, the Squire is the shortest and the most exacting of the courses at **PGA National Resort & Spa**. Tom Fazio referred to the Squire as "the thinking man's course." The golfer is required to test his or her accuracy with fairway woods and long irons from many tees — and the smaller greens demand precise iron shots. In addition, our North Palm Beach golf course has several doglegs to test the longer hitter's control. Success or failure on the doglegs will make or break your round.

The Squire has more natural environmental areas than the Haig, the General and the Champion. Teeming with native vegetation, these areas attract an abundance of wildlife. The 5th hole of this North Palm Beach golf resort course runs along part of the wilderness preserve, which borders the west side of the PGA National community.

The Squire is named after the immortal Gene Sarazen. Nicknamed "The Squire," he is as much a part of golf history as anyone who has played the game. He was a true competitor who became the first person to win the professional "Grand Slam" — the U.S. Open, British Open, PGA Championship and the Masters. His actions on and off the course were always exemplary, and he stands today as a credit to all who have enjoyed the game.

Boasting a world-class European spa, five championship courses, and seven spectacular restaurants, PGA National Resort & Spa is more than just a golfer's paradise. It's a stunning retreat that provides leisure

and business travelers with experiences both exciting and memorable.

The entry fee for the three-day tournament is only \$560.00 per player. The entry fee includes three rounds of golf for the tournament, two nights' accommodation,

breakfast on Saturday and Sunday, \$30.00 dinner voucher for Friday and Saturday, one free mulligan for each day (option to purchase additional mulligans will be available), skins game on Friday and Saturday and beverages on the course during tournament play. A Hospitality Suite will be available for your enjoyment.

UUCF is also selling the Survival Kit. Included in the package are: Friday: three mulligans, putting contest and Closest to the Pin contest; Saturday: three mulligans. two throws, putting contest, Closest to the Pin contest and Hole in One Contest: and Sunday: three mulligans, two throws, putting contest and Closest to the Pin Contest. If the above items were purchased separately, it would cost \$185.00. However, for golfers who purchase the Survival Kit prior to the first day of the tournament, the cost is only \$175.00. Golfers may also participate in the optional skins game on Sunday at a cost of \$50.00 per team.

There will be great prizes (first and second place each day), optional purchase of the skins game on Sunday and a lot of fun. There will also be prizes for Longest Drive and Closest to the Pin. We will also be holding a putting contest each day.

The tournament is open to the first 60 teams. Hurry and mail your entry fee along with the registration form. The deadline to register is August 26, 2009. Sleeping accommodations will consist of two people per one bedroom (two double beds). A registration/sponsorship package has been mailed to the full membership and is available on the website at www.uucf.com



Legislative Bills Passed During 2009 Session Which Affect Your Business

he 2009 Legislative Session ended on Friday, May 8, one week later than was expected. During the session, lawmakers debated many bills important to businesses. The following is a summary of some of the bills that passed:

Unemployment Compensation SB 810 by Senator Rudy Garcia and Representatives Dave Murzin. Florida employers are required to pay unemployment taxes on their company's payroll into the Florida Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund. This Trust Fund is used to pay benefits to those workers who lose their jobs.

Due to skyrocketing demands on the Trust Fund, it is very close to insolvency. The federal government has offered to provide assistance with federal stimulus dollars, but that money was offered with costly strings attached. Florida lawmakers wisely rejected this approach, which would have led to long-term increases in the unemployment taxes that businesses pay.

Instead, this bill tries to ease the financial burden on the Trust Fund by increasing the taxable wage base that unemployment taxes are collected on, from \$7,000 to \$8,500. This change will mean an average increase of around \$35 per employee per year, for the next several years.

Workers' Compensation HB 903 by Representative Anitere Flores and Senator Garrett Richter. As mentioned in prior issues of the *Ditchmen*, the Florida Supreme Court dealt businesses a damaging blow last October by throwing out limitation on attorney fees in workers' compensation cases. This limitation, which was put into law in 2003, was one of the main reasons that workers' compensation rates for businesses have decreased over 60% since then.

As a result of the Court's decision, the state approved a rate increase of 6.4% starting April 1, with additional rate increases expected in following years. **HB 903** restores the limitation on attorney fees back to the way it was in 2003 and limits the incentive for attorneys to drag workers' compensation cases out.

Thanks to the passage of this bill, the state expects to wipe out the 6.4% rate increase on July 1.

Safety Belt Law Enforcement SB 344 by Senator Nan Rich and Representative Rich Glorioso. Effective June 30, Florida police will be allowed to stop and cite motorists for not wearing their seat belts. Governor Charlie Crist reversed decades of public safety policy by signing a law that allows police to ticket motorists solely for not wearing seat belts. This issue gained new momentum this session because this is the last year Florida is eligible to draw \$35.5 million in federal highway safety funds by passing a stricter seat belt law.

Effective June 30, adults caught not being buckled up in the front seat will face a \$30 fine. The law already allowed for enforcement for drivers and passengers under 18.

Governmental Financial Information SB 1796 by Senator JD

Alexander. This bill requires a website be established for public access to government entity financial information. The initial phase will include appropriations data and expenditure data for all branches of state government. The Joint Legislative Auditing Committee will oversee the website and will propose additional phases of information to be made available. The committee will provide a proposal by March 1, 2010, to be submitted to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, that will include a

schedule of additional phases of information by the type of information to be provided for specific governmental entities, including local government units, community colleges, state universities, and other government entities that receive state appropriations. The proposal will include timeframes for additional phases as well as a proposed development entity for the additional information.

Growth Management SB 360 by Senator Mike

Bennett. This bill amends a number of provisions of law with the goal of stimulating economic development, promoting development in urban area and providing for affordable housing.

Extension of Permits. The bill creates an undesignated section of law to provide a retroactive 2-year extension and renewal from the date of expiration for:

- Any permit issued by the Department of Environmental Permitting or a Water Management District under ch. 373, part IV, F.S.,
- Any development order issued by the DCA pursuant to s. 380.06, F.S., and
- Any development order, building permit, or other land use approval issued by a local government which expired or will expire on or after September 1, 2008 to January 1, 2012. For development orders and land use approvals, including but not limited to certificates of concurrency and development agreement, the extension applies to phase, commencement, and buildout dates, including a buildout date extension previously granted under s. 380.016(19)(c), F.S.

The conversion of a permit from the construction phase to the operation phase for combined construction and operation permits is specifically



provided for. The completion date for any mitigation associated with a phased construction project is extended and renewed so the mitigation takes place in the appropriate phase as originally permitted. Entities requesting an extension and renewal must notify the authorizing agency in writing by December 31, 2009, and must identify the specific authorization for which the extension will be used.

Exceptions to the extension are provided for certain federal permits, and owners and operators who are determined to be in significant non-compliance with the conditions of a permit eligible for an extension. Permits and other authorizations which are extended and renewed shall be governed by the rules in place at the time the initial permit or authorization was issued.

OSHA Update

OSHA Offers Tips on Working Safely in Hot Weather

Those hot, hazy days of summer are approaching. The heat can be especially harmful for those who work outdoors in direct sunlight or in hot environments, making them susceptible to heat-induced illnesses such as heat stress, heat exhaustion or the more serious heat stroke.

"Working in extreme temperatures is not only uncomfortable, it can be life-threatening," said acting Assistant Secretary of Labor for

OSHA Jordan Barab. "As we move into the summer months, it is important for workers and their employers to minimize the chances of heat-induced illnesses, and imperative that they recognize the signs of heat stress and take proper precautions to reduce the chances of illness or death."

High temperature and humidity, physical exertion and lack of sufficient water intake can lead to heat-related stress. Symptoms of heat exhaustion or heat stroke include confusion, irrational behavior, loss of consciousness, abnormally high body temperature and hot, dry skin.

OSHA advises workers to take preventive measures such as reducing physical exertion and wearing light, loose-fitting clothing. The agency advises employers to provide workers with water and regular rest periods in a cool recovery area.

"Protecting Workers from the Effects of Heat" (http://www.osha.gov/ OshDoc/data_Hurricane_Facts/ heat_stress.pdf) and "Working Outdoors in Warm Climates" (http:// www.osha.gov/OshDoc/ data Hurricane Facts/ working_outdoors.pdf) are OSHA fact sheets that explain heat stress and provide recommendations to protect workers from exposure to ultraviolet radiation. 



Safety and Health Topics Pandemic Influenza

A pandemic is a global disease outbreak. An influenza pandemic occurs when a new influenza virus emerges for which there is little or no immunity in the human population: begins to cause serious illness; and then spreads easily person-toperson worldwide. A worldwide influenza pandemic could have a major effect on the global economy, including travel, trade, tourism, food, consumption and eventually, investment and financial markets. Planning for pandemic influenza by business and industry is essential to minimize a pandemic's impact.

It is difficult to predict when the next influenza pandemic will occur or how severe it will be. Wherever and whenever a pandemic starts, everyone around the world is at risk. Countries might, through measures such as border closures and travel restrictions, delay arrival of the virus, but cannot stop it.

be anticipated in the workplace, not only from patient to workers in health care settings, but also among coworkers in general work settings. A pandemic would cause high levels of illness, death, social disruption, and economic loss. Everyday life would be disrupted because so many people in so many places become seriously ill at the same time. Impacts could range from school and business closings to the interruption of basic services such as public transportation and food delivery.



Education and outreach are critical to preparing for a pandemic. Understanding what a pandemic is, what needs to be done at all levels to prepare for pandemic influenza, and what could happen during a pandemic helps us make informed decisions both as individuals and as a nation. Should a pandemic occur the public must be able to depend on its government to provide scientifically sound public health information quickly, openly and dependably. OSHA On– Site Consultation

OSHA's On-Site Consultation Service offers free and confidential advice to small and medium-sized businesses in all states across the country, with priority given to high-hazard worksites. Consultation services are totally separate from enforcement and do not result in penalties or citations.

Program Information

Using a free consultation service largely funded by the U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), employers can find out about potential hazards at their worksites, improve their occupational safety and health management systems, and even qualify for a one–year exemption from routine OSHA inspections.

The service is delivered by state governments using well-trained professional staff. Most consultations take place on–site, though limited services away from the worksite are available.

Primarily targeted for smaller businesses, this safety and health consultation program is completely

separate from the OSHA inspection effort. In addition, no citations are issued or penalties proposed.

It's confidential, too. Your name, your firm's name, and any information you provide about your workplace, plus any unsafe or unhealthful working conditions that the consultant uncovers, will not be reported routinely to the OSHA inspection staff.

Your only obligation will be to commit yourself to correcting serious job safety and health hazards — a commitment which you are expected to make prior to the actual visit and carry out in a timely manner.

Benefits

Knowledge of your workplace hazards and ways to eliminate them can only improve your own operations and the management of your firm. You will get professional advice and assistance on the correction of workplace hazards and benefit from on–site training and assistance provided by the consultant to you and your employees. The consultant can help you establish or strengthen an employee safety and health program, making safety and health activities routine considerations rather than crisisoriented responses. In many states, employers may participate in the OSHA Consultation SHARP (Safety and Health Achievement Recognition Program).

This program provides incentives and support to smaller, high-hazard employers to develop, implement and continuously improve effective safety and health programs at their worksite(s). The program recognizes employers who have demonstrated exemplary achievements in workplace safety and health by receiving a comprehensive safety and health consultation visit, correcting all workplace safety and health hazards, adopting and implementing effective safety and health management systems, and agreeing to request further

consultative visits if major changes in working conditions or processes occur that may introduce new hazards. Employers meeting these specific program requirements may be exempt from general scheduled OSHA inspections for one year.

How To Get Started

Because consultation is a voluntary activity, you must request it. Your telephone call or letter sets the

consulting machinery in motion. The consultant will discuss your specific needs with you and set up a visit date based on the priority assigned to your request, your work schedule, and the time needed for the consultant to adequately prepare to serve you. OSHA encourages a complete review of your firm's safety and health situation; however, if you wish you may limit the visit to one or more specific problems.

Registered Contractor License Renewal Reminder

Just a reminder that the Registered Contractor licenses issued by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) are up for renewal on August 31, 2009. Current law requires licenseholders to obtain 14 hours of continuing education with at least one hour in workplace safety, one hour in workers' compensation, one hour in business practices, one hour in the advance building code module, one hour in laws and rules (Chapter 489) and one hour in wind mitigation (this requirement only affects general, residential, building, roofing and glass and glazing contractors).


