



Certified Contractor License Renewal Reminder

Just a reminder that the Certified Contractor licenses from the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) are up for renewal on August 31, 2010. Current law requires licenseholders to obtain 14 hours of continuing education with at least one hour in workplace safety, one hour in workers' compensation, one hour in business practices, one hour in the advance building code module, one hour in laws and rules (Chapter 489) and one hour in wind mitigation (this requirement only affects general, residential, building, roofing and glass and glazing contractors).

Don't forget to notify the DBPR office of any address change. Section 489.124(2) gives sole responsibility to the licensee for notifying DBPR in writing of the licensee's current mailing address and phone number. Failure to notify the department of a change of address shall constitute a violation of this section. In addition, if your address changes and you do not notify the department, you may not receive important mailings from the department such as your renewal notice.

OIR Issues Order on Florida Workers' Compensation Rate Filing

lorida's workers' compensation rates are going down 6.8 percent due to a new law reinstating fee limits for lawyers who represent employees claiming injuries. The law restored limits originally passed in 2003 but struck down last year by the state Supreme Court. Insurance Commission Kevin McCarty on October 15, 2009 cited the new law as he approved the decrease. It's effective January 1, 2010. McCarty had approved a 6 percent increase effective April 1, 2009; but after the new law was passed, he repealed it. The new cut brings the total rate reduction since the 2003 legislation was passed to 63 percent. Florida's rates, once one of the nation's highest, now are among the lowest.

The rate reduction is based on the



annual review of the National Council on Compensation Insurance (NCCI),

which made their initial filing on August 20, 2009 proposing an overall workers compensation rate level decrease of 6.8% for the voluntary market industrial classes effective January 1, 2010. The Office of Insurance Regulation (OIR) issued an order accepting the overall workers compensation rate level decrease of 6.8% with two amendments.

The first amendment is a limitation on the roofing (5551) rate decrease to the average decrease for the contracting industry group which is 10.8%. The second amendment is to maintain the current minimum premium multiplier (MPM). NCCI had proposed an increase to the MPM. The MPM is used to calculate



Threshold Lowered for Reporting State Sales Tax Electronically

If your business collected \$20,000 or more in Florida sales tax during the prior state fiscal year of July 1, through June 30, you must now file your return and pay your sales tax to the state electronically. Previously, only businesses that collected \$30,000 or more in sales tax were required to file and pay electronically.

The easiest way for most small businesses to report and pay their sales tax electronically is to pay and file using the Department of Revenue's website. You can enroll in the Department's e-Services program at dor.myflorida.com/dor/ eservices. From this website, you can choose your filing and payment method, receive your User ID and Password and begin filing and/or paying electronically. This site also has a list of frequently asked questions that further explains the requirements of electronic filing and when payments are due.

Even if you are not required by law to file and pay sales tax electronically, you may wish to voluntarily enroll in e–Services. The process is fairly simple and allows you to file returns and make payments 24 hours a day through the Department's secure website. Filing electronically also can prevent costly math errors that are easy to make on paper returns.

Keep in mind that sales tax is not the only tax required to be filed and paid electronically. If your business had 10 or more employees during any

calendar quarter of the prior state fiscal year (July 1, 2008 – June 30, 2009), you must file your UCT–6 and pay your unemployment tax electronically. You can use the website listed above to enroll in this program as well.

If you are required to file and pay taxes on-line but you do not have the appropriate computer access, you may be eligible to receive a waiver from filing your tax return on-line. To request a waiver, please call the Department of Revenue at (800) 352–3671. Even if you receive a waiver from electronic filing, you will still have to pay electronically.

New Workers' Compensation WhistleBlower Website

The State Division of Workers' Compensation has established a new Non–Compliance Referral Database for citizens to report employers suspected of not providing workers' compensation insurance for their employees. The new website makes it easier to submit a complaint on–line and provides real–time feedback to those making a complaint. Over \$500,000 in penalties has already been assessed due to referrals made through the website.

Examples of non-compliant workers' compensation coverage include:

- Working without workers' compensation insurance.
- Under-reporting payroll of employees.
- Paying employees in cash instead of checks from payroll.
- Misclassifying employees' job

duties in order to receive a lower workers' compensation rate.

The new website is located at www.fldfs.com/WC/. Click on the peach–colored box that says "Report Suspected Workers' Comp Non–Compliance.

Attention Corporations: Don't Be Fooled By Scam

A company called Compliance Services is mailing notices to businesses that are titled "Annual Minutes Requirement Statement Directors and Shareholders." This document instructs you to submit the Annual Minutes Requirement Statement together with payment of \$125.00 so this company can prepare your corporation minutes for you.

Please be advised, this is a scam — corporations are required to keep minutes of their corporate meetings, but minutes do not have to be filed with any agency of the State of Florida. Also, you don't have to pay someone to prepare your corporate minutes. Please do not confuse this notice with an official notice sent by the state Division of Corporations relating to your Annual report.

OSHA Issues Final Rule Updating PPE Standards

The U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) published in the Federal Register a final rule revising the personal protective equipment (PPE) sections of its general industry, shipyard employment, longshoring and marine terminals standards concerning requirements for eyeand face—protective devices and head and foot protection.

OSHA is updating the references in its regulations to reflect more recent editions of the applicable national consensus standards that incorporate advances in technology. OSHA requires that PPE be safely designed and constructed for the tasks performed.

"Workers exposed to occupational hazards requiring head, foot, or eye and face protection will now be provided protection based on a standard that reflects state—of—the—art technology and materials," said acting Assistant Secretary of Labor for OSHA Jordan Barab. "This final rule is another step in OSHA's efforts to update or remove references to outdated national consensus and industry standards."

Amendments to the PPE standards include a requirement that filter lenses and plates in eye-protective equipment meet a test for transmission of radiant energy such as light or infrared.

Illness Data

On October 1, 2009, The U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) announced that it is initiating a national emphasis program (NEP) on recordkeeping (www.osha.gov/OshDoc/Directive_pdf/CPL_02_09-08.pdf) to assess the accuracy of injury and illness data recorded by employers.

The recordkeeping NEP involves inspecting occupational injury and illness records prepared by businesses and appropriately enforcing regulatory requirements when employers are found to be under-recording injuries and illnesses.

"Accurate and honest recordkeeping is vitally important to workers' health and safety," said acting Assistant Secretary of Labor for OSHA Jordan Barab. "This information is not only used by OSHA to determine which

workplaces to inspect, but it is an important tool employers and workers can use to identify health and safety problems in their workplaces."

The inspections include a records review, employee interviews and a limited safety and health inspection of the workplace. The NEP will focus on selected industries with high injury and illness rates.

At the request of the Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions and the House Committee on Education and Labor, the Government Accountability Office (GAO) issued a study on the accuracy of employer injury and illness records. This NEP will help OSHA work cooperatively with the GAO. It also complements the Labor Department's Bureau of Labor Statistics' (BLS) efforts to investigate factors accounting for differences between the number of workplace injuries and illnesses estimated by BLS and those estimated by other data sources.

Under the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, OSHA's role is to promote safe and healthful working conditions for America's men and women by setting and enforcing standards and providing training, outreach and education. For more information, visit www.osha.gov.

the lowest premium required in order to provide insurance under the standard workers compensation policy.

The OIR's order requested that NCCI amend its filing by October 28, 2009.

On October 19, 2009, NCCI submitted an amended filing in accordance with the OIR order. Upon approval by the OIR, the new rates and other rating values will apply effective January 1, 2010 to new and renewal policies.

Assuming the amended filing is approved as proposed, the overall average rate impact at an industry group level would be as follows:




