



Contractor V License Renewals

Just a reminder that the Contractor V license from the State Fire Marshal's office is up for renewal on June 30, 2010. Current law requires Contractor V licenseholders to obtain 14 hours of continuing education with at least one hour in fire protection discipline.

Reciprocity was established between the State Fire Marshal's office and the Construction Industry Licensing Board (CILB). Any hours obtained through CILB approved courses can apply towards your Contractor V license. The same applies to courses obtained through the State Fire Marshal's office.

Please note: Due to the heightened level of security in 2005, **ALL** passengers are required to have a passport. A passport at embarkation is strictly enforced. Anyone arriving at the port without a passport will be denied boarding and NO REFUND will be issued. No exception will be made, per Royal Caribbean. Everyone MUST have a passport when taking a cruise to any foreign port of call. If

DEP Announces Completed Projects with Stimulus Funds to Benefit Water Quality

-Federal funding to protect environment and public health, stimulate economy-

he Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) announced recently that it has committed all \$218.9 million in Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) project money made available through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA).

Florida secured the ARRA money to help local governments across the state finance improvements to wastewater, stormwater and drinking water facilities essential to protecting public health and the environment. Florida was one of the first states to meet all the requirements necessary to obtain the full amount of ARRA funds.

"Investing in our wastewater, stormwater and drinking water infrastructure is critical to water quality and public health protection for our citizens. The stimulus money offered an important supplement to our existing programs to fund infrastructure for local communities," said DEP Secretary Michael W. Sole. "These projects have also boosted the

local economy through job creation and helped provide the communities with new sources of revenue."

Twenty-eight projects have been awarded stimulus funds totaling more than \$132 million through the department's CWSRF and another 40 projects have been awarded more than \$86 million through the DWSRF. All local construction contracts have been awarded and all projects have started construction.

DEP received more than \$850 million in requests for the \$86.6







million of ARRA drinking water project funds and more than \$1.5 billion in requests competing for \$132.3 million in ARRA wastewater and stormwater funding. Qualifying projects were selected for ARRA funding, based on their construction-readiness and environmental or public health priority.

The East County Water Control District (ECWCD) is a prime example of stimulus money at work. With \$2,418,819 awarded by DEP on June 26, 2009, ECWCD has completed construction of the Harns Marsh Phase I Improvements and the Yellowtail Replacement Project— Florida's first completed ARRA projects. Working with DEP, ECWCD has been able to replace four structures and build one new structure in order to reduce flooding to downstream neighbors on the Orange River, improve water quality and storage; and recharge the groundwater aguifers.

The Harns Marsh Phase I Improvement Project and Yellowtail 1A Replacement Project created jobs that otherwise might not have been available in a down economy. More than 40 jobs in construction, engineering and project management put money in people's pockets and into the businesses of local communities.

"The support ECWCD has received from DEP enabled us to improve our services to local residents by replacing and constructing much needed infrastructure," said Dave Lindsay, ECWCD District Manager. "The Harns Marsh Phase I and Yellowtail Replacement Projects have allowed us to recharge local basins, alleviate flooding to our Orange River residents and prepare for water storage for the 2010 rainy season."

ECWCD preserves and protects water resources in Lehigh Acres (eastern Lee County) and western Hendry County through drainage, conservation, mitigation, navigational and water management practices.

The District maintains 360 culvert crossing, 22 bridges, 66 water control structures and maintains 1,298 preserve acres within 70,000 acres of land – approximately 68,000 of which lie in eastern Lee County.

DEP established its SRF programs, under agreements with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, to provide low-interest financing to plan, design and build wastewater, stormwater and drinking water systems. Funded by federal capitalization grants, state matching funds, loan repayments, interest earnings, and periodic bond issues, SRF loans are offered at interest rates substantially below current market rates and help make loans affordable.

Since 1999, Florida has invested more than \$3.7 billion to upgrade and improve water and wastewater facilities and clean up stormwater pollution, funding about 2,400 projects statewide.



White House PLA Rule Goes Final Business Lines up in Opposition

During the week of April 11, the Obama Administration issued a federal rule that implements an Executive Order (EO) that was signed by President Obama in February 2009. The rule encourages federal agencies to require "project labor agreements" (PLAs) for all construction projects larger than \$25 million, essentially meaning that only contractors who

agree to union representation are eligible for federal projects. Although the rule does not throw a blanket requirement subjecting all federal projects to PLAs, it would require federal agencies to develop PLA policies that that could be applied to individual federal projects. Under the final rule, the threshold of the original EO is maintained (\$25 million for federal construction projects) and PLA's could not be retroactively applied to federal projects already underway.

NUCA does not oppose policies that allow for PLAs between the project owner and the contractor(s) working on the project. However, we do oppose federal requirements that mandate the use of PLAs. Therefore, NUCA joined several business organizations signing a letter in support of the Government Neutrality in Contracting Act (H.R. 983) introduced by Rep. John Sullivan (R-OK), stating that the bill would "curb waste and favoritism in federal construction contracting and ensure that taxpayer-funded construction contracts are awarded on sound principles that will deliver to taxpayers the best possible product at the best possible price." The legislation would prohibit government mandated PLAs on federal projects, while permitting contractors and subcontractors to voluntarily enter into PLAs after the project has been bid.

As the Hotel Deadline Approaches, NUCA Issues Heat up - We Need You in DC Next! Month!

This Friday, April 23 is the cut-off

deadline to receive the special discounted rate at the Hyatt Regency on Capitol Hill for the NUCA Washington Summit, May 17 – 19, 2010. This year, your participation has never been more important: the issues we are working can put the underground utility construction industry back to work, put two burdensome tax issues to rest and ensure a fair environment in labor relations.

With construction unemployment remaining at around 24 percent, advocating for legislation that will provide public and private dollars in the water and wastewater infrastructure market will be JOB #1. Legislation (HR 537) that would eliminate the state volume cap on private activity bonds (PABs) has passed the House and is gaining momentum in the Senate (see previous article). Passage of the bill would open the door to limitless private capital in our market.

Two notorious tax issues are reaching critical deadlines. Unless Congress agrees on a fix, the federal estate tax (death tax) will return to previous (2000) levels. Also, the dreaded "government 3% withholding" tax will take effect in 2012 unless we kill it this year or next.

Although "card check" legislation has stalled for the moment, organized labor is no shrinking violet – they will pull out all the stops over the next several months to move the Employee Free Choice Act this year. So unless you're okay with a facilitated process regarding union affiliation and binding government arbitration when a contract isn't agreed to in 90 days, we respectfully suggest you have a vested interest in this year's Washington Summit.

Looking for Assistance to Send Your Child to College this Fall?

The NUCA Foundation for Education and Research wants to help! Any high school senior whose parent or legal guardian is employed by a NUCA member company in good standing at the time of the application deadline may apply. Student employees, including parttime employees, are also eligible, as are dependents of NUCA Chapter Executive Directors. 

Certified Contractor License Renewal Reminder

Just a reminder that the Certified Contractor licenses from the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) are up for renewal on August 31, 2010. Current law requires licenseholders to obtain 14 hours of continuing education with at least one hour in workplace safety, one hour in workers' compensation, one hour in business practices, one hour in the advance building code module, one hour in laws and rules (Chapter 489) and one hour in wind mitigation (this requirement only affects general, residential, building, roofing and glass and glazing contractors).

Don't forget to notify the DBPR office of any address change. Section 489.124(2) gives sole responsibility to the licensee for notifying DBPR in writing of the licensee's current mailing address and phone number. Failure to notify the department of a change of address shall constitute a violation of this section. In addition, if your address changes and you do not notify the department, you may not receive important mailings from the department such as your renewal notice.





Solis Announces New OSHA Enforcement Initiatives

Secretary of Labor Hilda Solis announced a number of major new OSHA enforcement initiatives during her April 14 keynote address the National Action Summit for Latino Worker Health and Safety. OSHA currently requires that training provisions under OSHA standards be provided in a language or a form that workers can understand. OSHA further requires that its Compliance Officers check and verify that workers have received the training required by OSHA standards. The Agency will expand upon this and effective on April 28 — Workers Memorial Day — Secretary Solis explained, "OSHA will also assure that its Compliance Officers check and verify not only that the training has been provided, but that it was provided in a format that the workers being trained can understand." The Secretary also announced a new pilot program where OSHA will work with local building inspectors to assure worker safety and health protection. In construction, the four leading causes of worker deaths are falls, electrocution, being crushed or caught between and being struck. Inspectors participating in this pilot program will notify OSHA when they observe unsafe work conditions leading to these four major causes of workplace fatalities.


