





# UUCF/Andrew Scott Johnson Memorial Scholarship Foundation Schedules Eleventh Annual Bass Fishing Tournament


The tournament will be a two-day event. Five fish per boat, per team, per day. There is a minimum of two people on a team. No team can consist of more than three people. Paid professional guides cannot be considered as a team member. This will be a catch and release tournament and will be scored in accordance with the B.A.S.S. guidelines. However, the use of live bait is permitted! (After all, this is for FUN!) Professional guide services are available through the foundation.

The schedule for both days is as follows: Check in/Registration starting at 6:30 a.m.; Cast Off at 7:00 a.m. (or safe light); and Weigh-

in starts at 2:00 p.m. The cost to register for this event is \$85.00 per person. The registration fee includes a T-Shirt, hat and raffle ticket at registration. Hotel accommodations, meals, bait, boats and professional guides are not included in this fee.

# U.S. Labor Department's OSHA Extends Comment Period to March 21, 2011, Announces Stakeholder Meeting on Noise Control Interpretation

Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration announced that it is extending by 90 days the official comment period on the proposed interpretation titled "Interpretation of OSHA's Provisions for Feasible Administrative or Engineering Controls of Occupational Noise," which was published in the Federal Register on October 19. Interested parties are encouraged to submit comments by March 21, 2011.

The agency also announced that it will hold a stakeholder meeting before the end of the comment period to listen to the concerns of businesses and workers about the proposed noise interpretation.

"We're very eager to get input from those parties who would be affected by this proposed interpretation," said Dr. David Michaels, assistant secretary of labor for occupational safety and health. "We have by no means completed our review of the issue and seek to make an informed decision that is in the best interest of protecting workers, yet sensitive to the operating changes businesses would need to make."

Thousands of workers every year continue to suffer from preventable hearing loss due to high workplace noise levels. Since 2004, the Bureau of Labor Statistics has reported that more than 125,000 workers have suffered significant, permanent hearing loss. In 2008 alone, BLS reported 22,000 hearing loss cases.

Responding to continuing high levels of hearing loss among employees in the nation's workplaces, the notice proposed to make enforcement of the hearing conservation standard consistent with enforcement of other OSHA standards by clarifying the term "feasible administrative or engineering controls" as used in OSHA's general industry and construction occupational noise exposure standards.

OSHA's current enforcement policy

for noise exposures less than 100 decibels has not accurately reflected the noise standard's requirements that feasible engineering and administrative controls be used as the primary means of reducing noise exposure. Instead, OSHA has allowed many employers to rely upon a hearing conservation program, including the use of hearing protectors such as ear plugs.

"There is sufficient evidence that hearing protection alone cannot prevent workers from suffering preventable hearing loss," said Michaels. "Easily applied administrative or engineering controls can and must be used to protect workers. There are plenty of employers out there who play by the rules and want to do the right thing, and we're hopeful we can work with them to craft a policy that's good for all."



# OSHA Will Hold Informal Public Hearing on Proposed Rule to Prevent Worker Injuries on WalkingWorking Surfaces

OSHA will hold an informal public **hearing** starting January 18, 2011, on the proposed rule revising the Walking–Working Surfaces and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) standards to improve worker protection from slip, trip, and fall hazards.

"These public hearings will provide an important opportunity for stakeholders who will be impacted by the rule to share their concerns and provide input on the proposal," said OSHA Assistant Secretary Dr. David Michaels.



# Associate Member of the Month: Duval Asphalt

# FDOT District 2 and Duval Asphalt Partner to bring the first Warm-Mix Asphalt project to Northeast Florida!

Just over a year ago, August 2009, marked a key accomplishment towards making Jacksonville a more environmentally friendly community. It is no secret that area road construction will not be ending anytime soon. As Jacksonville continues to grow, the need for new roads and repairing existing roads grows. Many of these projects rely on asphalt. Traditionally, Hot–Mix Asphalt (HMA) was the only option. Not anymore!

On August 5, 2009, Duval Asphalt, in conjunction with the Florida Department of Transportation

(FDOT) and our construction partners, began the installation of WMA on J. Turner Butler Boulevard. This is the first FDOT project of its kind in Northeast Florida.

WMA looks and performs like hot mix asphalt, but introduces new "Green Technologies" that allow it to be manufactured at much lower temperatures - as much as 50 to 100 degrees Fahrenheit cooler than traditional HMA (giving it the name 'warm' mix asphalt). The drastic reductions in temperature and increased efficiency of production reduce fossil fuel consumption and greenhouse gas emissions by as much as 14%. Additionally, because production can be achieved at much cooler temperatures there is virtually no smoke and no smell, an attribute

commonly associated with HMA.

Engineering and construction benefits include better compaction; a safer and more comfortable work environment; the ability to pave at lower temperatures; the potential to use a higher rate of recycled material; and a longer pavement life due to less oxidation of the mix.

An additional point of interest regarding asphalt – whether traditional HMA or WMA – is that it is 100% recyclable. In many cases, pavements produced using Reclaimed Asphalt Pavements (RAP) are as high or higher in quality as pavements made of all–virgin materials. Furthermore, asphalt

at the PGA National Resort & Spa in Palm Beach Gardens.

- Held the Tenth Annual Bass Fishing Tournament for the **UUCF/Andrew Scott Johnson** Memorial Scholarship Foundation at Big Toho Marina in Kissimmee.
- Distributed \$22,000.00 in scholarships from the UUCF/ Andrew Scott Johnson Memorial Scholarship Foundation.
- UUCF PAC Contributed a total of \$33,500.00 to candidates during the 2010 Election cycle.
- Presented the Annual Construction Performance Awards for the Mitchell Ellington Award, Garv D. Sawyer Award and Andrew J. Mayts Award.

The top priority for UUCF during the 2011 Legislative Session will be Competitive Bid. Throughout this year, reports have been coming into

the UUCF office that local governments are trying to self perform water and sewer projects. Florida Statute 255.20 requires local governments to competitively bid projects that are estimated to be in excess of \$300,000. UUCF will be proposing amendments to the existing Competitive Bid Statute in order to close up loopholes and put some teeth in the law.

UUCF will also be working on or monitoring other construction and business legislative issues that could include:

- revising the statutory formula for the Workers' Compensation Special Disability Trust Fund.
- DBPR will probably introduce a legislative package that could address pre-licensure education and contractor licensing bonds.
- proposed changes to the Florida Construction Lien Law.
- anti-geographic bid preference.

- crane ordinances.
- immigration tied to e-verify
- revisions to the Notice of Nonpayment statute.

The proposed rule, described in the May 24 *Federal Register*, will prevent annually about 20 workplace fatalities and more than 3,700 injuries that are serious enough to result in lost work days.

"Injuries and fatalities from fall

hazards are a leading cause of work-related injuries and we need to have the best rule possible to ensure that we effectively address this serious hazard," said Michaels.


Proposed revisions will include specific criteria for personal fall protection equipment that are consistent with industry voluntary consensus standards. Revisions will also better align OSHA's general industry walking—working surfaces standards with the Agency's construction and shipyard industry standards.

The hearing will begin at 9:30 a.m., at the U.S. Department of Labor, 200 Constitution Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20210. If necessary, the hearing will continue on subsequent days at the same time and location.

Individuals interested in testifying at the hearing must submit a notice of intent to appear by November 30. Only those persons submitting notices will be permitted to present testimony, questions witness and OSHA, and participate in the posthearing comment period. Individuals who request to testify for more than 10 minutes or who intend to submit documentary evidence at the hearing must submit the full text of their testimony and evidence by December 21. See the hearing notice for submission details.

Technical questions and public hearing inquiries should be directed to Virginia Fitzner, Office of Safety Systems, at (202) 693–2052. Individuals requesting special accommodations to attend or testify at the hearing should contact Veneta Chatmon, Office of Communications, at (202) 693–1999.

# OSHA 300-A Form - Summary of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses Must be Posted

This is a reminder that all companies are required to post the Summary of Work–Related Injuries and Illnesses (Form 300–A) — by February 1 of the year following the year covered by the form and keep it posted until April 30 of that year.

The OSHA 300–A Form, along with OSHA Forms 300 and 301, is

available on OSHA's website at http:// www.osha. gov/ record keeping.

**Employers** must keep a Log of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses and Summary for each establishment or site. If you have more than one establishment, you must keep

# Registered Contractor License Renewal Reminder

Just a reminder that the Registered Contractor licenses from the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) are up for renewal on August 31, 2011. Current law requires licenseholders to obtain 14 hours of continuing education with at least one hour in workplace safety, one hour in workers' compensation, one hour in business practices, one hour in the advance building code module, one hour in laws and rules (Chapter 489) and one hour in wind mitigation (this requirement only affects general, residential, building, roofing and glass and glazing contractors).

Don't forget to notify the DBPR office of any address change. Section 489.124(2) gives sole responsibility to the licensee for notifying DBPR in writing of the licensee's current mailing address and phone number.

Failure to notify the department of a change of address shall constitute a violation of this section. In addition, if your address changes and you do not notify the department, you may not receive important mailings from the department such as your renewal notice.



a separate Log and Summary for each physical location that is expected to be in operation for one year or longer. Note: you can use a workers' compensation or insurance form, if it contains the same information.

Note that your employees have the right to review your injury and illness records. You must keep the Log and Summary for five years following the year to which they pertain.

# **OSHA** Interpretation

July 26, 2010

Letter # 20071001-7893

**Re:** English language proficiency at construction sites.

**Question:** Is there an OSHA requirement that obligates employers to ensure that their employees can communicate with supervisors and co-workers in English at construction sites so that they can understand safety training and instructions and coordinate safely with co-workers?

**Answer:** While there are construction standards that require training and instructions, there are no OSHA





construction standards that specifically require that such information be conveyed and understood in English. For example, 29 CFR 1926.21(b)(2) states:

The employer shall instruct each employee in the recognition and avoidance of unsafe conditions and the regulations applicable to his work environment to control or eliminate any hazards or other exposure to illness or injury.

Certain OSHA construction standards supplement the requirement of 1926.21(b)(2) by requiring that employees receive training in specific topics. One example is 29 CFR 1926.503(a)(1), which provides:

The employer shall provide a training program for each employee who might be exposed to fall hazards. The program shall enable each employee to recognize the hazards of falling and shall train each employee in the procedures to be followed in order to minimize these hazards.

The employer's duty under the construction standards to train and instruct employees in how to comply with OSHA standards and to avoid hazards in the work environment necessarily means that employers must present information in a manner that employees are able to understand. As OSHA stated in the OSHA Training Standards Policy Statement, dated 04/28/2010:1

[R]egardless of the precise regulatory language, the terms "train" and "instruct," as well as other synonyms, mean to present information in a manner that employees receiving it are capable of understanding.<sup>2</sup>

In addition, it is common that, for safety reasons, construction employees need to be able to communicate with supervisors and co—workers. However, an OSHA obligation in that regard would be met by any system in which that communication could reliably occur; there is no OSHA requirement that the communication system be based on the English language.

# DBPR and Jacksonville Sheriff's Office "Sting" Unlicensed Contractors in Jacksonville

At the end of September, the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR), in partnership with the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office and the State Attorney's Office for the Fourth Judicial Circuit, completed a threeday sting called "Operation Hammerdown" targeting unlicensed contactors. Twenty—two unlicensed contractors were issued cease and desists notices by DBPR and notices to appear by JSO.

"We are committed to taking proactive measures to keep the public safe and protect them from unlicensed and unscrupulous contractors," said Secretary Charlie Liem. "We will continue partnerships with local law enforcement to ensure Floridians are protected."

DBPR investigators gathered advertisements for construction work from online classifieds, such as Craigslist.org. Suspected unlicensed contractors were asked to come to the "sting" house to give estimates for work that requires licensure. When the individuals failed to provide their contractor licenses, they were issued notices and cease and desist and notices to appear for unlicensed contracting. Investigators also provided information on how to obtain a license. The ultimate goal is to bring the individuals into compliance with state law and protect consumers.

Below are precautions that consumers can take to help protect themselves from unlicensed individuals:

- Always ask to see the State of Florida license.
- Note the license number and verify that the license is current.
   To check a license, call (850) 487–1395 or visit www.MyFloridaLicense.com.
- Ask for references and check each one.
- Do not pay cash and be cautious of writing checks made payable to individuals, especially when dealing with a company.
- Get everything in writing, including a detailed description of the work to be completed, a completion date and the total cost.
- Report suspected unlicensed activity at www.MyFloridaLicense.com or toll-free at (866) 532-1440.
