

Pre-Session Review of 2010 Legislative Session

he big cloud hanging over this Legislative Session will be budgetary issues and how to address the basic needs of our state with the \$3 billion budgetary shortfalls that has been estimated by the state's budgetary gurus. Some budget analysts, including Governor Charlie Crist, have suggested that state revenues are slowly increasing and that the shortfall will not be as severe. Crist has included expenditures in his recommended budget that neither House nor Senate leadership are convinced we can fund. To make those expenditures, Crist sweeps more trust fund dollars and includes revenues from gambling that are yet uncertain. We heard that the Feds will give us our full share of Medicaid dollars despite our refusal to adopt federal mandates. That will certainly help fund one of Florida's largest expenses, but both state and local coffers are low and the budget will remain the major focus of the 2010 Legislative Session. We will see issues debated such as how to deal with constitutional requirements for shrinking class size in the face of a shrinking budget. Senator Don Gaetz (R - Niceville) and Representative Will Weatherford (R - Wesley Chapel) have proposed a constitutional amendment to relax the constitutional class size requirements passed by the voters, citing bussing of students and cuts in elective classes as some of the negative impacts that we can expect without a chance.

Unemployment Compensation

For the business community at large, the severe increase in unemployment compensation rates that became effective January 1 are a major issue. House Speaker Larry Cretul has released a schedule that would have the House poised to pass unemployment compensation tax relief for Florida businesses by the end of the first week of the 2010 session. The increase was automatic after the number of unemployed spiked, but

businesses have complained that they weren't prepared for how steep the increase was. **House Speaker Larry Cretul** is pushing a plan to delay much of the tax increase for the next two years, and wants the fix approved by the first full week of session in early March, to beat the tax payment deadline of April 1.

The House Economic Development and Community Affairs Council has already approved the short-term fix moving the measure to the House Finance & Tax Council.


Jobs, Jobs, Jobs

A Senate committee has unveiled a 115-page draft version of its "Jobs for Florida" bill that would make changes to both economic development incentive programs and state regulatory activities. The price tag for the legislation, which has not yet been developed, is

expected to be "significant" and could be as much as \$200 million.

Included in the measure is a recommendation to delegate permitting authority now held by the Department of Environmental Protection to local government and extend permit extensions granted in last year's growth management bill, **SB 360**, for another three years.

The legislation would also include a host of tax breaks, tax credits and incentives including: Expanding a tax incentive for manufacturing, placing a cap on sales tax collected on sale of aircrafts or boats, giving a tax credit to businesses that hire out-of-work people, increase the amount set aside for tax incentives used to lure businesses to the state and create a revolving loan program to provide low-interest loans to Florida businesses having less than 50 employees.





The following is a list of other issues that UUCF will be working on during the 2010 Legislative Session:

HB 691 and SB 982 - Relating to Underground Facility Damage Prevention & Safety (Murzin/Bennett)

Sunshine State One Call of Florida, Inc.'s (SSOCOF) Legislative ad hoc Committee finalized revisions to the Underground Facility Damage Prevention and Safety Act, Chapter 556, F.S., and have secured legislative sponsors for the proposal.

The Underground Utility Contractors of Florida (UUCF) is represented on the committee by Mike Woodall, John Woody, Inc. of Jacksonville and UUCF Vice President, who is the excavator representative on the SSOCOF Board, along with R. Bruce Kershner, UUCF Executive Vice President. Both Woodall and Kershner are pleased with the final product.

Though there are numerous proposed changes to the "one call law" in the upcoming Legislative Session, 85% or better have nothing to do with underground utility contractors. Some of those changes entail cleaning up old language and getting rid of a few items that have never been used. Many of the controversial issues have been removed such as the removal of marks by the excavator, mandatory white lining and others. One issue that UUCF was able to preserve was the life of a locate ticket. It will

remain 30 days.

UUCF has worked with SSOCOF to include in the proposed changes the creation of an alternative dispute resolution process. The proposed arbitration suggestion came to UUCF from some of its members. It is also one of PHMSA's nine elements. The program would be available to excavators and member operators regarding disputes arising from excavation activities including loss of service, down time, delays or loss of use of facilities.

Other changes include:

- increasing non-criminal penalty from \$250.00 to \$500.00.
- establishing low-impact marking practices.
- excavators shall pre-mark (white line) the proposed area of the excavation if the site cannot be adequately described.
- "High-priority subsurface installations" has been added to the definitions and are limited to gas and petroleum facilities.
 Excavators will be required to provide notice of the planned excavation start date and time and will communicate with the operator of the facility a mutually agreed-upon excavation plan.

SB 1056 - Relating to Local Government Prompt Pay (Baker)

It has been several years since the legislature has made any substantial changes to the Local Government Prompt Pay Act. However, recent

reports of local governments not paying on time and using loop holes in the statute to delay payment has begun to surface. This bill attempts to plug those loopholes by requiring the local governments to include the requirements for a "proper invoice" to be included in the bid documents. In addition, the "agent" who is required to review the payment request must be identified in the bid documents as well.

Other Issues UUCF Will Monitor

HB 693, SB 1048 and SB 510 - Construction Liens & Bonds (Plakon/Baker/Wise)

These bills are similar, have received their committee assignments in the House and Senate and are ready to be heard. These bills are similar to those filed during the 2009 Session but do contain edits and updates since last year. A main focus of the bill is to improve the information provided to consumers to provide a thorough explanation of their rights and obligations under the lien law along with the tools to protect themselves and to ensure delivery of the information. To that end, the bill creates a "General Statement of Owners Rights and Responsibilities Under Florida's Construction Lien Law," requires them to sign a receipt that they have received the information and requires the receipt to be filed with the building official when the permit is applied for. In addition, the bill implements

"Amendment 4" Likely to Cost 267,247 Florida Jobs, Major Economic Study Says

P lorida business, civic and labor leaders gathered in Tallahassee on Tuesday to hear the report of a top Florida economist showing that Amendment 4 — a proposed change to the state constitution — would lead to heavy job loss and higher costs for Floridians.

"The losses of Florida jobs under the 'Most Likely Scenario' are very high," reported Tony Villamil, economist for Washington Economics Group, the organization that conducted the study. "Amendment 4's passage will have potentially devastating consequences to Florida's economy at a time when the economic situation at both the state and national levels is uncertain and at a time when attracting new businesses to Florida is essential for the future recovery and prosperity of the state and its residents."

The study considers a "Modest" and a "Most Likely" economic impact scenario. The study does not predict a "Worst Case" scenario. According to the study:

Under both scenarios, Florida's economic dynamism is lost. This would permanently impact the economic growth potential for Florida, causing a steady decline in the standard of living of all Florida residents. Further, permanently impacting employment and growth within major industries and jobgenerating activities.

"If you like the recession, you'll love Amendment 4," said Mark Wilson, President of the Florida Chamber of Commerce. "This amendment will cost jobs, hurt taxpayers and make it more expensive to live in Florida."

In an unprecedented show of unity, will be developed due to the



labor and business leaders agreed to jointly oppose Amendment 4.

"It's not too often that a union leader and a business leader agree on something," said Frank Ortis, President of the Florida State Council of Machinists and Aerospace Workers. "But we can all see how much Amendment 4 would hurt Florida's working families. And we are working together to defeat it."

Ortis and Wilson serve together on the board of Citizens for Lower Taxes and a Stronger Economy, Inc., the group formed to defeat Amendment 4. That organization is chaired by former South Bay Mayor and National League of Cities President Clarence Anthony.

"No single item on the 2010 ballot has the potential to weaken Florida's economy and hurt Florida's taxpayers more than Amendment 4," said Anthony. "If passed, this amendment will trap Florida's communities in gridlock."

The economic study indicates that Amendment 4 will also have a major impact on Florida taxpayers. According to the study:

Additionally, Florida's tax revenues would sharply slow as a result of Amendment 4's passage as fewer commercial and residential properties will be developed due to the

increased costs and uncertainty associated with each comprehensive land—use plan referendum. This would force local and state governments to either raise taxes or cut services. Public schools, public safety and local health care services would suffer from both the direct impact of Amendment 4 (delay construction until the next election) and the indirect impact of fewer tax revenues from which to fund needed operations and capital investments.

If Amendment 4 is adopted, Florida would become the guinea pig for a measure that has never been adopted in any other state in the country. However, the small Florida town of St. Pete Beach adopted a local version of Amendment 4 in 2006. Since then, the town has seen fewer jobs, higher tax rates and endless litigation at taxpayer expense.

"Our experiment in Amendment 4 has turned St. Pete Beach into a battleground for special interests," said Ward Friszolowski, the former Mayor of St. Pete Beach. "And at a time of economic hardship, it has caused extraordinary damage to our economy."

"I ask the voters of Florida to learn more about St. Pete Beach — and to learn from our mistakes," said Friszolowski. "Amendment 4 supporters promise that they'll give you a 'say on growth.' Don't believe it. Don't let them do to Florida what they already did to my hometown."

OSHA Update

U.S. Department of Labor's OSHA Proposes Recordkeeping Change to Improve Illness Data

The U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) is proposing to revise its Occupational Injury and Illness Recording and Reporting (recordkeeping) regulation by restoring a column on the OSHA Form 300 to better identify work-related musculoskeletal disorders (MSDs). The rule does not change existing requirements for when and under what circumstances employers must record musculoskeletal disorders on their injury and illness logs.

Many employers are currently required to keep a record of workplace injuries and illnesses, including work-related MSDs, on the OSHA Form 300 (Log of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses). The proposed rule would require employers to place a check mark in a column for all MSDs they have recorded.

The proposed requirements are identical to those contained in the OSHA recordkeeping regulation that was issued in 2001. Prior to 2001, OSHA's injury and illness logs contained a column for repetitive trauma disorders that included noise and MSDs. In 2001, OSHA separated noise and MSDs into two separate columns, but the MSD column was deleted in 2003 before the provision became effective. OSHA is now proposing to restore the MSD column to the OSHA Form 300 log.

"Restoring the MSD column will improve the ability of workers and employers to identify and prevent work-related musculoskeletal disorders by providing simple and

easily accessible information," said Assistant Secretary of Labor for OSHA Dr. David Michaels. "It will also improve the accuracy and completeness of national workrelated injury and illness data."

Comments must include the agency name and docket number for this rulemaking (Docket Number OSHA–2009–0044). The deadline for submitting comments is March 15. OSHA will hold a public meeting on the proposed rule March 9.

numerous measures that ensure construction bonds are recorded and placed on file with building officials so that they are available to the general public, updates mailing provisions to include global express delivery for international mail, resolves issues of single liens on multiple lots and units in a condo or other development, eliminates the automatic expiration of notices of commencement and eliminates two improper payment traps for owners, makes warnings consistent throughout the statute, requires demands to include sufficient information to identify the project, gives permit officials the ability to reject incomplete and illegible documents and raises the exemption from notice requirements for small one-day projects.

Sales Tax on Construction Materials to Schools and Other Tax Exempt Entities

This has long been an issue for

UUCF and other construction groups. The collection burdens and liability to material suppliers under the current statutory scheme for tax exempt sales is unwieldy and unfair. Despite our best efforts, the revenue estimates that are attached to any solution which streamlines this process have prevented our previous success on this issue, with the exception of some simplification and cleanup to the rules which we accomplished numerous years back. With budget constraints this year worse than ever,

Certified Contractor License Renewal Reminder

Just a reminder that the Certified Contractor licenses from the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) are up for renewal on August 31, 2010. Current law requires licenseholders to obtain 14 hours of continuing education with at least one hour in workplace safety, one hour in workers' compensation, one hour in business practices, one hour in the advance building code module, one hour in laws and rules (Chapter 489) and one hour in wind mitigation (this requirement only affects general, residential, building, roofing and glass and glazing contractors).

Don't forget to notify the DBPR office of any address change. Section 489.124(2) gives sole responsibility to the licensee for notifying DBPR in writing of the licensee's current mailing address and phone number. Failure to notify the department of a change of address shall constitute a violation of this section. In addition, if your address changes and you do not notify the department, you may not receive important mailings from the department such as your renewal notice.



our approach must be dramatically different. Proponents have identified three issues of importance:

- 1) A statutory change to clarify in law (as opposed to rule) that the tax exempt transaction must be a direct one between the supplier and the tax exempt entity, with the tax exempt entity assuming responsibility for materials ordered on the account and billings and payment direct to the tax exempt entity with no middle—man;
- 2) A statutory change to shift responsibility for compliance with direct purchase requirements to the tax exempt entity to the extent that the entity controls the spirit of the transaction by contract, purchase order or the actions of its agents or employees; and
- 3) To participate in the efforts of the House and Senate to pass statutory changes to the methodology utilized by the Revenue Estimating Conference to determine the financial impact of legislation. HB 93 by Crisafulli, HB 121 by Poppell and SB 1178 by Haridopolos all seek to implement cost benefit analysis in making these determinations, creating a stronger requirement to look more closely at the long-term economic benefits of legislation rather than just the lost or expended revenues. Long term, the use of such a methodology could have a positive impact on our efforts to simplify the direct purchase process.

HB 755 and SB 878 - Notice of Nonpayment Revisions (Holder/Thrasher)

These bills were filed on behalf of the Florida AGC Council and would require a Notice of Nonpayment to be a sworn document accompanied by any and all documents evidencing the amount claimed, such as the contract or purchase order with amendments and change orders, invoices, pay requests, bills of lading, delivery receipts or similar documents and a statement of

account reflecting all payments requested and received. The bill as filed would also eliminate bond rights for any claimant who is deemed to have not complied with these provisions.

HB 617 and SB 1338 - Life of the Mine Legislation (Bembry and Dean)


These bills would extend to limestone mining the same "Life of the Mine" permitting that phosphate mines have. The bill also addresses the formula for wetland mitigation.

Every year, there are many and varied bills filed that affect construction contracting. We have identified those bills we believe have that potential and included them in a tracking list. That list is continuously updated as new bills are filed and identified and will be provided to you weekly during Session along with legislative updates. They include issues supported and/or opposed by other members of The Construction Coalition and others. If any of these issues rise to the forefront during the Legislative Session, we will be reporting on them in the weekly Legislative Reports. At the present time, those issues include:

- Preemption to local regulation of cranes and hoisting devices
- Bills that would prohibit a local jurisdiction from giving a local bid preference
- Bills that would prohibit any outof-state employees on public projects
- Immigration
- Workplace safety

And Don't Forget Amendment 4 (Hometown Democracy)!

The defeat of Amendment 4 this November is the key to insuring that




