





# UUCF/Andrew Scott Johnson Memorial Scholarship Foundation Schedules Eleventh Annual Bass Fishing Tournament

The schedule for both days is as follows: Check in/Registration starting at 6:30 a.m.; Cast Off at



# Voters Deliver Crushing Defeat to Anti-Growth Amendment 4

In an Election Day characterized by nail—biters and close—calls, the battle over Amendment 4 stands out for being anything but. Voters handed no—growth interests a stunning, across—the—board defeat on Tuesday, November 2 decisively rejecting the draconian anti—growth measure that would have required taxpayer—funded referenda for all changes to local comprehensive land use plans. The amendment was soundly defeated in every region and rejected by a majority of voters in both major parties, as well as Independents.

"Voters overwhelmingly agree that one of Florida's most important economic sectors should not be held hostage," said Ryan Houck, executive director of Citizens for Lower Taxes and a Stronger Economy. "Floridians saw through the rhetoric and

recognized Amendment 4 for what it was — a dangerous, costly and job–killing anti–growth measure that would have driven our state deeper into recession."

Unlike most ballot initiatives, Floridians have been debating Amendment 4 for the better part of a decade — since it was first drafted in 2003. Since that time, a historic coalition has formed to oppose the anti–growth measure, including Florida's top business, labor, civic and planning groups as well as every major newspaper and both leading candidates for Governor.

"In the beginning, opposition to Amendment 4 was controversial and by the end, it was consensus," said Houck. "That's because Floridians had years to learn about this amendment, study its details and consider its consequences. The result was not just a resounding rejection of Amendment 4, but also a rejection of the anti–growth philosophy that underpins it."



# What Do You Do If You Think You Have Reason To Protest A Bid?

s everyone in our industry knows, the majority of construction work currently being performed is in the public sector. That means we have more contractors fighting for fewer contracts, and profit margins evaporated long ago. Because public construction contracts are typically awarded via a competitive bid process, there are certain rules that are intended to ensure that the contract is awarded in a fair manner. The intent of this article is to make sure our readers know how to protect their rights if they feel a letting is not being conducted in a fair manner. This month, we will discuss the procedural steps that should be taken, in general terms, if you think you may have grounds to protest a bid. Next month, we will discuss some examples of legitimate grounds to protest a bid letting.

The main thing to keep in mind regarding bid protests is that the protesting bidder must act as soon as the bidder becomes aware of the potential problem with the bid. If the bidder fails to put the owner on notice of the protest, then the bidder could lose its right to protest. The Florida Administrative Procedures Act (APA) governs bid protest procedures when the public owner is the State or a State agency, and the APA provides specific deadlines that must be followed whether protesting a bid prior to the letting or afterwards. The APA does not apply to municipalities and counties unless they have expressly adopted the APA bid protest procedures as their

own. Nonetheless, even if a county or municipality has not expressly adopted the APA bid protest procedures, many of them have created their own bid protest procedures modeled after the APA. Thus, familiarity with the APA procedures is helpful and we will use the APA as the foundation for this discussion of bid protest procedures.

The APA addresses two types of protests: Pre-bid protests, and postbid protests ("specification protests"). Most contractors think of a post-bid protest, which takes place after the bids have been opened, when they think of a bid protest. The APA, however, also addresses pre-bid protests which must be filed before the bids are opened. For example, if prior to the opening of the bids, a bidder becomes aware of a defect such as ambiguous specification, an improper requirement that equipment be obtained from a sole source, or perhaps an improper restriction regarding who may submit a price, then the bidder is obligated to notify the owner of the defect prior to the letting.

Pre-bid protests must be filed prior to the letting so that the public owner has an opportunity to correct the problem. The APA states that when a potential bidder becomes aware of a problem prior to the bid, the bidder must notify the owner within 72 hours of receipt of the bid documents and then provide a formal written protest within 10 days of providing the notice of intent to protest. Failure to meet these deadlines can mean the right to

protest is lost. The intent of the prebid protest procedures is to avoid wasting time on a defective letting. If the defect can be fixed prior to the letting then that is the desired solution, rather than waiting until the bids have been submitted. The notice of intent to protest can be as simple as a one paragraph letter putting the owner on notice. The formal protest, however, generally requires more effort as it must specifically identify the facts and legal authority supporting the protest.

The APA also defines when a post-bid protest must be filed. The initial notice of intent to protest is to be delivered to the public owner within 72 hours of the owner's publication of the bid results and intent to award. Then, the APA states that the disgruntled bidder must deliver a formal written protest within 10 days of the notice of intent to protest. Failure to meet either of these deadlines will mean the protest is waived.

The procedures governing a protest of a state contract are easy to identify, because the APA controls. But, what is a bidder to do if the owner is a municipality or county or some other public agency where the APA may not apply? A wise first move is for the bidder to simply call the person designated by the owner as the procurement officer/manager. The bidder should let the procurement official know that the bidder believes it has grounds to protest, ask what deadlines apply to preserve the protest, and where to



obtain a written copy of the protest procedure. Then, immediately after the telephone conversation the bidder should send a letter to the procurement official via fax or hand delivery confirming the conversation. Once a copy of the actual protest procedure has been obtained, it must be read to determine and verify any deadlines that apply and the level of detail that must be included in the protest documents. If the protest procedure requires an initial notice of intent to protest, then the confirmatory letter might satisfy that requirement, but the specific rules need to be read to make sure, because a second or third letter may be needed to preserve the protest.

Some bid protest procedures require a protestor to post a bond to serve as security for the payment of any costs that are incurred by the owner in defending against a protest. For example, Section 287.042, Florida Statutes, requires

that a protestor provide a bond equivalent to 1% of the proposed contract amount. Bidders should also be aware that if Section 255.20, Florida Statutes, applies, then a successful protestor may recover its costs as well as fees from the owner.


Most formal protest procedures. including those governed by the APA, provide for informal dispute resolution prior to institution of formal proceedings. The APA provides that within 7 days of receiving the formal protest the government will meet with the protestor to see if a settlement can be negotiated. If settlement discussions are unsuccessful, then the matter is referred to the Department of Administrative Hearings which will schedule and administer a bench trial before an Administrative law Judge provided by the state.

The APA provides that upon receipt of a notice of intent to protest and absent exceptional circumstances,

the letting is to be suspended until the dispute is resolved. Even absent a formal rule requiring that the letting be suspended, public owners will frequently suspend the letting in order to give the parties an opportunity to resolve the issue. Florida law states that a public contract awarded in contravention of the competitive bid law is void. A contractor that has received payment under a void contract can be required to return those dollars to the owner. Therefore, most public owners will simply table the award until the matter is resolved rather than risk the inconvenience and expense of making a payment under a void contract.

If the procuring government lacks any written bid protest procedures, then the protestor generally must file a lawsuit in the state Circuit Court asking a judge to order that the bid letting be stopped until the court

determines whether the bid letting was improper.

Some bid protests are resolved merely by informing the owner of the perceived problem. More often than not, however, the parties "lawyer up" in order to make sure that the competitive bid rules have been followed. Your lawyer cannot help you, however, if you have missed a deadline for preserving your protest. So, the first thing you (or your lawyer) need to do in a protest situation is determine what deadlines apply and make sure those deadlines are met.

# OSHA Will Hold Informal Public Hearing on Proposed Rule to Prevent Workers Injuries on Walking— Working Surfaces

SHA will hold an informal public *hearing* starting
January 18, 2011, on the proposed rule revising the Walking–Working
Surfaces and Personal Protective
Equipment (PPE) standards to improve worker protection from slip, trip and fall hazards.

"These public hearings will provide an important opportunity for stakeholders who will be impacted by the rule to share their concerns and provide input on the proposal," said OSHA Assistant Secretary Dr. David Michaels. The proposed rule, described in the May 24 *Federal Register*, will prevent annually about 20 workplace fatalities and more than 3,700 injuries that are serious enough to result in lost work days. "Injuries and fatalities from fall hazards are a leading cause of work–related injuries and we need to have the best rule possible to ensure that we effectively address this serious hazard," said Michaels.

Proposed revisions will include specific criteria for personal fall protection equipment that are consistent with industry voluntary consensus standards. Revisions will also better align OSHA's general industry walking—working surfaces standards with the Agency's construction and shipyard industry standards.

The hearing will begin at 9:30 a.m., at the U.S. Department of Labor, 200 Constitution Ave., N.W., Washington, D.C. 20210. If necessary, the hearing will continue on subsequent days at the same time and location.

Individuals interested in testifying at the hearing must submit a notice of intent to appear by November 30.

# Registered Contractor License Renewal Reminder

Just a reminder that the Registered Contractor licenses from the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) are up for renewal on August 31, 2011. Current law requires licenseholders to obtain 14 hours of continuing education with at least one hour in workplace safety, one hour in workers' compensation, one hour in business practices, one hour in the advance building code module, one hour in laws and rules (Chapter 489) and one hour in wind mitigation (this requirement only affects general, residential, building, roofing and glass and glazing contractors).

Don't forget to notify the DBPR office of any address change. Section 489.124(2) gives sole responsibility to the licensee for notifying DBPR in writing of the licensee's current mailing address and phone number.

Failure to notify the department of a change of address shall constitute a violation of this section. In addition, if your address changes and you do not notify the department, you may not receive important mailings from the department such as your renewal notice.

# Secretary of Labor Hilda Solis Announces Partnership with U.S. Department of Transportation to Combat Distracted Driving by Workers

# OSHA Launching initiative to Discourage Texting While Driving on the Job

B ecause motor vehicle crashes are a leading cause of worker fatalities, Secretary of Labor Hilda L. Solis today announced a partnership between the U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration and the U.S. Department of Transportation to combat distracted driving.

"It is imperative that employers eliminate financial and other incentives that encourage workers to text while driving," said Secretary Solis. "It is well recognized that texting while driving dramatically increases the risk of a motor vehicle injury or fatality."

Prohibiting texting while driving is

the subject of an executive order signed by President Barack Obama last year for federal employees and the subject of rulemaking by the Department of Transportation.

OSHA is launching a multi-pronged initiative that includes:



# Florida Minimum Wage Will Not Increase for 2011

The Florida minimum wage rate for calendar year 2011 will stay the



same as the current minimum wage of \$7.25 an hour. This means that for the second year in a row, both the Federal minimum wage and Florida minimum wage are the same rate. All Florida employers should continue paying their employees at least the minimum wage of \$7.25 per hour.

Even though the Federal minimum wage and Florida minimum wage are the exact same, Florida employers are still required to display two minimum wage posters: a federal poster and a state—specific poster.

Every time a new poster is required for Florida businesses, private poster companies will send you mail to scare you into buying expensive "compliance packages." Be very wary of these companies, and please do not spend any money until you fully understand what you need and what you are buying.

- An education campaign for employers, launched during "Drive Safely Work Week" in early October, will call on employers to prevent occupationally related distracted driving, with a special focus on prohibiting texting while driving.
- An open letter to employers to be posted on OSHA's website, http://www.osha.gov during "Drive Safely Work Week." The website also will showcase model employer policies and encourage employer and labor associations to communicate OSHA's message.
- Alliances with the National Safety Council and other key organizations as outreach to employers, especially small employers, aimed at combating distracted driving and prohibit texting while driving.
- Special emphasis on reaching younger workers by coordinating with other Labor Department agencies as well as alliance partners and stakeholders.





 Investigate and issue citations and penalties where necessary to end the practice when OSHA receives a credible complaint that an employer requires texting while driving.

"We call upon all employers to prohibit any work policy or practice that requires or encourages workers to text while driving," said Assistant Secretary of Labor for OSHA Dr. David Michaels. "The Occupational Safety and Health Act is clear; employers must provide a workplace free of recognized hazards."

OSHA's role is to assure these conditions for America's working men and women by setting and enforcing standards, and providing training, education and assistance. 
