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## UUCF President's Cup Golf Tournament Scheduled

ome and enjoy three wonderful days and two nights at the Orange County National Golf Center and Lodge in Winter Garden, Florida on October 21-23. You will enjoy three fun-filled days of golfing on three different 18 hole courses. Participants will have the opportunity to play on the Panther Lake Golf Course on Friday and Saturday and Crooked Cat Golf Course on Sunday. A different tournament will be held on each course. The format will be a two-man scramble, two-man best ball and two-man alternate shot. All tournaments will be handicapped so everyone will have an equal opportunity to win.

Mike Woodall with John Woody, Inc. is chairing this year's tournament. A portion of the proceeds from this year's tournament will benefit the UUCF Legal Defense Fund.

#### Panther Lake Golf Course -

Panther Lake is everything you could want in a golf course. Playing over rolling meadows, through native pines, around and over wetlands, lakes, and up and down elevation changes of up to 60 feet, it is first and foremost a visual delight, reminding you that natural beauty is one of the main reasons you play golf and a major factor in deciding which course to play.

Panther Lake offers some of the best examples of natural beauty that Orlando area golf courses have to offer. One of the highlights is that there is no development on or around the course – a Florida golf course with no homes! You will likely encounter many native species of birds and wildlife during your round, which will be enjoyed in the most tranquil of settings.

Every hole on Panther Lake is unique and requires something different from your shot making repertoire. This is another feature that makes this Central Florida golf course so special; when you finish your round you will likely be able to recall each hole very vividly as they are all very different in

appearance as well as appealing in design to the eye.

The variety in design is evident in the way no two holes play alike. There are no boring holes at Panther Lake, and each is as distinct and memorable as the last. The only characteristic the holes share is that each shot demands good thinking and precise execution.


Off the tee, you will face gently sloping fairways guarded by strategically placed fairway bunkers, trees and water hazards that frame the holes and provide a clear line of play. From the fairway, you will hit many approaches into well–guarded elevated greens, which are large and have plenty of contours, so two-putting isn't automatic.

Simply put, good shots will be rewarded and bad shots penalized, the hallmark of great courses

everywhere. If you're looking for a bit more golf course, the tour tees provide as stern a test as you'll find anywhere, with intimidating carries and risk-reward approaches that can lead to birdies or bogeys. From the three forward tees, you'll face shorter carries, softer angles and wider landing areas, making Panther Lake more friendly but no less memorable.

When you play #10, look at the shot from 150 yards to the green. That is the spot where Tiger Woods was told to "Get more forgiving irons, the Nike Pro-Combos" by his talking headcover, Frank, during the very popular commercial. Will you be able to hit the elevated green from there with your irons?

**Crooked Cat Golf Course** – Like Panther Lake, Crooked Cat features significant elevation changes, rolling fairways and large, contoured greens. But with fewer trees, wider





landing areas, native heather and mounding framing the fairways, Crooked Cat presents golfers more of a links–style look. It may well be the most naturally beautiful Orlando Florida golf course.

The course's open feel encourages golfers to grip it and rip it off the tee, and there is certainly more room for error and multiple options for playing a hole—both off the tee and into the greens. Crooked Cat is not a connect—the—dots course; feel free to go outside the lines like a kindergartener's finger painting. But beware: As with links—style courses, there is an element of chance, and a wayward shot can end up in one of many seemingly randomly placed grass bunkers. Gamblers and scramblers will do well.

So will shot makers. Crooked Cat is more exposed and the routing twists and turns, so the wind comes at you from ever-changing directions and is a real factor. Players who appreciate the challenge of working the ball—up, down, left, right—to counteract or ride the wind will get a chance to showcase their mastery and get the most out of the course.

The back nine of Crooked Cat may be the best nine on the property and is the favorite of many low handicap golfers due to its length and challenge. Even if you don't have ball shaping down to an art or the deft touch to escape like Houdini from any peril in your way, Crooked Cat is incredibly fun to play. And because of the unique design you'll never get tired of challenging this course because you

will never play any hole the same way twice. No other Orlando Florida golf course offers this much versatility, challenge, and fun.

The entry fee for the three–day tournament is only \$485.00 per player. The entry fee includes three rounds of golf for the tournament, two nights' accommodation, breakfast on Saturday and Sunday, barbecue cook out dinner on Saturday, one free mulligan for each day (option to purchase additional mulligans will be available), skins game on Friday and Saturday and beverages on the course during tournament play. A Hospitality Suite will be available for your enjoyment.

UUCF is also selling the Survival Kit. There will be great prizes (first and second place each day), optional purchase of the skins game on Sunday and a lot of fun. There will also be prizes for Longest Drive and Closest to the Pin. We will also be

holding a putting contest each day.

### **Registered Contractor** License Renewal Reminder

Just a reminder that the Registered Contractor licenses from the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) are up for renewal on August 31, 2011. Current law requires licenseholders to obtain 14 hours of continuing education with at least one hour in workplace safety, one hour in workers' compensation, one hour in business practices, one hour in the advance building code module, one hour in laws and rules (Chapter 489) and one hour in wind mitigation (this requirement only affects general, residential, building, roofing and glass and glazing contractors).

Don't forget to notify the DBPR office of any address change. Section 489.124(2) gives sole responsibility to the licensee for notifying DBPR in writing of the licensee's current mailing address and phone number.

Failure to notify the department of a change of address shall constitute a violation of this section. In addition, if your address changes and you do not notify the department, you may not receive important mailings from the department such as your renewal notice.



## Summary of FDOT Pipe Advisory Group (PAG) Meeting and Specification Topics Part I of II

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n August 10, 2011, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Pipe Advisory Group (PAG) met to discuss storm pipe issues. Below is part one of a partial list of topics discussed at the PAG meeting. These topics of joint performance and pipe structural design tables represent issues that direct impact contractors. This article is a two part series. Part two of this article will be published in the next issue of the *Ditchmen*.

#### Joint Performance

FDOT Drainage Office is concerned that storm pipe infiltration is inundating stormwater pond bleedoff weirs. FDOT ponds are designed to revert to a certain elevation. As a pond fills, the water elevation exceeds the bleed-off pipe and water drains out of the pond. FDOT is concerned that the flow rate of storm pipe infiltration will inundate the bleed-off flows and perhaps put the pond in a continual state of bleed-off. At this time, the concerns appear to be speculative and there seems to be minimal evidence that this is occurring in the field.

The State Drainage Engineer stated that the Department is willing to accept some infiltration through the lock seams of corrugated metal pipe, but that, to the contrary they do not want any joint infiltration. To the some, this seems to be a tacit approval of some reasonable, allowable leakage. The concrete pipe industry would concur that the

industry should consider adopting a reasonable infiltration allowance.

FDOT suggested that to prevent joint infiltration the Department is considering increasing the in-plant hydrostatic pressure test from 5 psi (current requirement) to 10.8 psi. The consensus from producers and non-FDOT at the meeting was that changing the in-plant joint test is not likely to result in different results in the field.

It appears that FDOT is the only state that desires "zero leakage." Even typical sanitary sewers specify a measurable, numeric leakage tolerance, such as 200 gallons per inch diameter per mile of pipe per day. If the FDOT were to allow a 200 inch–gallon tolerance (rather than zero), then the allowable infiltration into a 250–ft run of 24 inch pipe would be 0.0004 cfs (4 ten thousandths of a cubic foot per second).

FDOT and some producers discussed the possibility of field infiltration tests in conjunction with the pipe inspections, and they suggested that contractors may welcome such a test if paid for by the Department. A field infiltration test (not an air test) would essentially plug the pipe and monitor any elevation change over a specific time period.

Rinker suggested that any further discussion of field tests or raising the joint test requirement should include comments from the underground

utility contractors. Further discussion also warrants input from consultant engineers. In order to reach a reasonable infiltration policy, pond hydraulic engineering facts and design parameters should be discussed. FDOT indicated that they would seek the input from contractors, most notably FTBA. At this point, it is not clear as to which direction the Department will proceed on this matter.

## FDOT Index 205 Pipe Design Tables

FDOT is revising the installation design tables for concrete, plastic, and metal pipe to reflect a new design standard (i.e., LRFD) The FDOT is coordinating with each respective pipe industry before they release the tables for general industry review. However, FDOT welcomes comments from engineers and contractors.

FDOT has nearly completed the concrete pipe design table but is verifying the installation properties of 100% compaction of A–2–4 and A–4 soils. Generally, it appears that FDOT believes that their Standard Specifications Section 125 concrete pipe installation specifications result in a "Type 1" standard AASHTO installation, which is a very high quality installation. Incidentally, Type 1 AASHTO installations allow 90% to 95% compaction of some soils. However, FDOT Construction and

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
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

Drainage Offices have indicated that they are very satisfied with the historical performance of requiring 100% compaction for concrete pipe and that the design table will be consistent with the installation requirements.

The development of the thermoplastic design tables is more complicated given the proprietary corrugation profiles and variability of installation/geotechnical parameters. The FDOT is challenged to simplify the thermoplastic pipe design table(s) while at the same time taking into account that different HDPE and PVC pipe producers have different proprietary corrugation profiles, and some producers have not submitted their proprietary designs for review as of yet. Additionally, the thermoplastic pipe design tables will take into account the presence of groundwater which has a significant effect on the pipe's ability to withstand buckling and structurally perform, in addition to buoyancy.

Some areas of the state have minimal groundwater, however, other areas such as Orlando, South Florida, and Southwest Florida have groundwater at or near to the finished grade elevation.

Given the complex nature of the exercise. FDOT does not expect to have the tables competed until close to the end of 2011. We believe it is very important on contractors' behalf that all of the Index 205 tables (rigid or flexible pipe) should list the design parameters and assumptions so that contractors can make informed decisions about whether acceptable pipe performance can be achieved given the site geotechnical conditions and any potentially conflicting installation specifications. This is important for FDOT projects, but perhaps more important for municipal and private projects that reference FDOT standards. If a design was not done properly to verify structural performance of the soil-pipe envelope, then why should the contractor be held liable in the event of unacceptable performance?

It should be noted that most discussion focused on maximum burial depth rather than minimum depth under roadway. It appears that there may be no planned changes at this time for minimum burial depths from the current Index 205 for either rigid or flexible pipe materials.
