> UUCF/Andrew Scott Johnson Memorial Scholarship Foundation Holds Eleventh Annual Bass Tournament to Benefit the Foundation's Scholarship Program

T he UUCF/Andrew Scott Johnson Memorial Scholarship Foundation, Inc. held its Eleventh Annual Bass Fishing Tournament on Lake Toho in Kissimmee on February 25–26, 2011. The tournament, held to raise funds for the foundation's scholarship program, was headed up by Fishing Tournament Chairman Scott Johnson with Johnson–Davis, Inc.

The Annual Tournament is held in memory of Andrew Scott Johnson, son of Scott Johnson. Andy Johnson worked summers with his father's company, but he especially liked to fish.

This is the eleventh year for the UUCF/Andrew Scott Johnson Memorial Bass Tournament, and this year's event drew a field of 38 participants divided in to 16 teams.

This year's event began with a Captain's Meeting on Thursday evening. Teams fished on Friday and Saturday, with a weigh–in held following each day's fishing. Following the Friday weigh–in, participants enjoyed a barbecue dinner. Trophies and prizes were presented following Saturday's closing weigh–in.

Trophies were awarded for the largest fish caught on Friday and Saturday. In addition, first, second and third place team trophies were presented to the teams accumulating the greatest total two-day catch. Teams could weigh in a maximum of five bass per day.


At the end of the first day's fishing, the Precision Pipe & Products, Inc. team of Gilmer Nelson and Bobby Wakefield were in first place with a total catch of 33.13 pounds. The HD Supply Waterworks team of Don Webster, Tommy Thompson and Monty Goodman were in second place with a total catch of 33.05 pounds. The U.S. Concrete Products, Inc. team of Greg Wolf and Steve Bails were in third place with a total catch of 25.27 pounds.

The biggest fish on the first day of fishing went to the team of Precision Pipe & Products, Inc. for catching a bass weighing 9.46 pounds.

On day two of the tournament, the

biggest fish went to the B.A.S.I.C. Engineering team of Justin James and John Fernandez. Their winning fish weighed 9.88 pounds.

The Big Fish Pot was held again this year. Participants paid \$10.00 toward the Big Fish Pot. The Big Fish Pot was paid to the participant/team with the single largest fish caught in the two-day tournament. One hundred percent of the funds collected were presented to the winner of the Big Fish Pot, John Fernandez of the team of B.A.S.I.C. Engineering. Congratulations John.



When the second day's weigh-in was complete, the HD Supply Waterworks team of Don Webster, Tommy Thompson and Monty Goodman were the first place winners with a total day catch of 30.77 pounds. Second place for the day went to the Johnson-Davis, Inc. team of Scott Johnson and Bob Hopler with a total catch of 30.5 pounds. Third place for the day went to the Precision Pipe & Products, Inc. team of Gilmer Nelson and Bobby Wakefield with a total catch of 29.33 pounds.

With their total two day's tournament combination, congratulations to the following winners: Overall First Place Winners: Don Webster, Tommy Thompson and Monty Goodman with the team of HD Supply Waterworks with a total twoday catch of 63.82 pounds. 

### 2011 Legislative Session Update

T he 2011 Legislative Session began on Tuesday, March 8.

With a new Governor devoid of political experience who wants to run the state lean and mean like a business in a fiscal crisis, everything is fair game. The laundry list of changes being proposed is exhaustive, but major proposed changes for Florida include combining health care related agencies into one; creating a new Department of Commerce to head up economic development; reorganization, privatization, and/or dismantling of the Department of Children & Family Services, the Department of Community Affairs, and the Department of Corrections; an overhaul of the state Medicaid program with a goal of total managed care; major changes to state employee benefits requiring them to pay more for health insurance and contribute to their own retirement plans; and tightening the state's constitutional cap on revenue collection.

The following is a list of UUCF Priorities:

### Local Government Self-Performing

Florida Statute 255.20, Competitive Bid Law," requires local governments to bid competitively any public works project in excess of \$300,000. The construction industry continues to lag in recovery in Florida as the latest unemployment statistics show that construction lost 24,000 jobs (6.7 percent) over the past year. In five vears, construction has lost 355,000 jobs or about 52 percent of its workforce. In light of these statistics, it is very important to have the Legislature address the issue of local governments continuing to self perform public works projects. UUCF has made this a priority issue for 2011. Please support the "free



market" and stop local governments from self-performing public works projects.

### **Open Competition Act**

HB 923 by Van Zant; SB 1352 by Hays

This is the prohibition of union only "Project Labor Agreements" (PLAs) in public construction which includes state funds. The bill also extends the existing time period for filing a notice of protest to a bid solicitation. Existing law only provides for 72 hours within which to notice a protest. The bill extends this time period to a more reasonable seven days. The bill also prohibits a governmental agency from prohibiting a contractor who is qualified and properly licensed from performing work on a public works project.

### **Bid Preference (State Funded)**

HB 427 by Tobia; SB 574 by Wise These bills prohibit the use of geographic price preferences when public projects in Florida are state funded or state assisted.

### Numeric Nutrient Water Quality

CS/HB 239 by Williams; SB 1090 by Dean; SB 1490 by Evers The bill prohibits the Department of Environmental Protection, water management districts and other governmental entities from implementing federal rules relating to numeric nutrient water quality criteria.

### Stop Raiding STTF

The House Transportation & Economic Development Appropriations Subcommittee is proposing to raid the State Transportation Trust Fund (STTF) by taking \$880 million in cash . . . resulting in a negative impact of \$2 billion to FDOT's Work Program. That's \$2 billion worth of transportation projects already planned all across Florida – and the roughly 60,000 jobs associated with them! Jobs will be lost if the proposed cuts are approved.

### Background Screening for Non-Instructional School District Employees and Contractors

HB 627 by Perry; SB 906 by Dean These bills provides that the employee may obtain a single certificate which is good statewide to meet the Class II Security Clearance. The certificate will be issued by the Department of Agriculture & Consumer Services.

### **Unemployment Compensation**

CS/CS/HB 7005 by the Economic Development & Tourism Subcommittee; CS/CS/SB 728 by Detert

The House bill decreases the state benefit from 26 weeks to 20 weeks, strengthens employer defenses to an unemployment compensation claim, and decreases the weekly benefit to 12 weeks when the employment rate reaches 5%. The Senate bill does not have the provision for decreasing the number of weeks state benefits are paid.



Ditchmen March 2011

These bills have been stalled over the past week awaiting word from AGC on additional changes requested by the proponents. Without agreement on the issues, it will be difficult to move them forward this year.

### Electrical Journeyman Requirements

HB 607 by Weinstein; SB 838 by Wise

These bills are another attempt by the unions to require more electrical journeyman on industrial and commercial jobsites. The bills would lower the square footage requirement from 50,000 to 5,000 square feet and raise the voltage requirements from 77 volts to 98.

### Regulation of Hoisting Equipment

HB 1057 by Artiles; SB 612 by Evers

These bills are an ABC Crane Council priority and create a statewide crane safety act relating to radio communications between crane operators, preparation for high wind events and penalties for licensed contractors who violate the act. These requirements would preempt any local government regulations and create a statewide standard.

### State Reciprocity in Workers' Compensation Claims

HB 723 by Weinstein; SB 1286 by Bennett

These bills provide that an employee of a Florida company who is working on a temporary basis in another state is still covered by the employer's Florida workers' compensation coverage, and an employee from another state who is working on a temporary basis in this state is still covered under the Workers' Compensation policy in the home state. A temporary basis is defined as no more than 10 consecutive days or 25 total days in a year.

### Growth Management/Impact Fees

HB 7001 by Community & Military Affairs Committee; SB 174 by Bennett HB 7021 by Community & Military Affairs Subcommittee; SB 410 by Bennett In 2009, the Florida Legislature passed a bill to codify the burden of proof for impact fee challenges, placing the burden of proof on the government to prove by a preponderance of the evidence that the impact fee is valid. In response to litigation by local governments currently pending in circuit court, SB 410 and HB 7021 would re-enact the provisions. In order to ensure that the law is not an unconstitutional mandate, the new legislation requires


Unlike many other featured

approval of each house of the Legislature by two-thirds of its members. The House version adds language that the legislature finds that it "fulfills an important state interest" to further protect it from a mandate challenge.

Enforcement of Immigration Laws HB 7089 (formerly JDC 11-01) by House Judiciary; SB 2040 (formerly PCB 7066)

### Registered Contractor License Renewal Reminder

Just a reminder that the Registered Contractor licenses from the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) are up for renewal on August 31, 2011. Current law requires licenseholders to obtain 14 hours of continuing education with at least one hour in workplace safety, one hour in workers' compensation, one hour in business practices, one hour in the advance building code module, one hour in laws and rules (Chapter 489) and one hour in wind mitigation (this requirement only affects general, residential, building, roofing and glass and glazing contractors).

Don't forget to notify the DBPR office of any address change. Section 489.124(2) gives sole responsibility to the licensee for notifying DBPR in writing of the licensee's current mailing address and phone number.

Failure to notify the department of a change of address shall constitute a violation of this section. In addition, if your address changes and you do not notify the department, you may not receive important mailings from the department such as your renewal notice.

Ditchmen March 2011

by Senate Judiciary In additional to other provisions in the bill, the main sections of the bills affecting employers would require all employers by July 1, 2012 to check new hires through the federal government's E-Verify system. It requires contractors and subcontractors working on public projects to do so by January 1. 2012. The Senate Bill allows an employer to avoid utilization of E-Verify if they obtain an unexpired drivers' license, passport or national identification card when utilizing the current I–9 process.

### **Secondary Metal Recyclers**

HB 343 by Metz; SB 622 by Hays These bills would implement electronic transaction reporting to law enforcement for secondary metal recyclers.

### **Tangible Personal Property Taxes on Heavy Equipment** HB 243 by Workman; SB 384 by

Bogdanoff These bills authorize a person who

rents heavy equipment under shortterm rental agreements to collect a TPP recovery fee from the renter.

### The "Paycheck Protection Act"

CS/HB 1021 by Dorworth; CS/SB 830 by Thrasher These bills prohibit local governments from providing automatic withdrawal of union dues used for political purposes without annual approval by the employee.
