
### **UUCF 2012 Convention**

### Governor Rick Scott Regarding Signing of the Numeric Nutrient Standards Ratification Bill

n Thursday, February 16, 2012, Governor Rick Scott signed *HB* 7051, the Numeric Nutrient Standard Ratification Bill which backed proposed water quality rules that are intended to replace federal rules opposed by utilities, industry and agriculture groups. HB 7051 waives a state law requirement that the proposed rules be ratified by the Legislature. The rules will go back to the Legislature for approval if major changes are made as a result of the legal challenge or the EPA review.

According to Governor Scott, "I signed legislation paving the way for Florida to present the state's rules for numeric nutrient standards in Florida's water bodies to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for final approval. The future of our state's environment and economy depend on the health of our water bodies, and the state's rules will ensure the protection of both."

"The state's rules are scientifically

sound, protect the environment and avoid unnecessary costs for Florida's households and businesses. Once approved by EPA, they will further enhance the State's nationally recognized nutrient control programs."

Agriculture Commissioner Adam Putnam released the following statement today in support of state and federal action on numeric nutrient criteria.

"Today, Governor Scott made an important decision for the future of our state, signing Florida's alternative to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) numeric nutrient criteria into law. I would like to thank the Governor for his swift action to ensure the EPA's costly rules were not implemented, as they could have been detrimental to our state's agriculture industry and business community.

I also support Senator Rubio's efforts to block the overreaching

arm of the EPA. Florida has already demonstrated a commitment to protecting its water supply by applying sound science and establishing attainable goals. I look forward to working with landowners and business owners to continue Florida's already proven record in assessing the health and enhancing the quality of our state's bodies of water."

In response to Governor Scott's signing of the Numeric Nutrient Standards Ratification bill, Attorney General Pam Bondi issued the following statement.

"My office has stood strongly against the federal government's imposition of costly and unnecessary regulations, and I am pleased that Governor Scott has today signed into law an alternative to the Environmental Protection Agency's numeric nutrient criteria. Florida has always had the best expertise and resources to determine how to

protect our waters."

DEP Secretary Herschel T. Vinyard Jr. said, "Governor Rick Scott signed legislation today that supports Florida moving forward with setting numeric nutrient standards for our water bodies, by presenting our rules for to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for final approval. A healthy environment depends on getting Florida's water right, in terms of both water supply and water quality. No one knows Florida's water better than Floridians, and these rules will allow us to effectively protect water quality in our state.

"Our rules provide a clear process for identifying waters impaired by nutrients, preventing harmful discharges and establishing necessary reductions. They provide a reasonable and predictable implementation strategy, and avoid unnecessary costs for Florida's households and businesses.

"We are pleased that we will now be able to submit our widely supported rules for final EPA approval. It's important to start addressing our nutrient challenges, and we look forward to getting these rules on the books and implemented as soon as possible."

### National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES)

 $oxed{oxed}$  ater pollution degrades surface waters making them unsafe for drinking, fishing, swimming, and other activities. As authorized by the Clean Water Act, the Florida NPDES program controls water pollution by regulating point sources that discharge pollutants into waters of Florida. Point sources are discrete conveyances such as pipes or manmade ditches. Individual homes that are connected to a municipal system, use a septic system, or do not have a surface discharge do not need an NPDES permit; however, industrial, municipal, and other facilities must obtain permits if their discharges go directly to surface waters. Since its introduction in 1972, the NPDES permit program is responsible for



significant improvements to our Nation's water quality.



### 2012 Legislative Session Update

As we head into the seventh week of our nine week Legislative Session, issues continue to line up in each of the two chambers. Redistricting is currently in the hands of the courts, prison privatization and mega—casino proposals are dead and the focus has turned to other priority issues including PIP insurance, tax cuts, long awaited claims bills and of course the budget for FY 2012—2013—the only piece of legislation the Florida Legislature is required to pass.

### Redistricting

Oral arguments on the Legislature's proposed redistricting maps for the House and Senate will be held on a day that only comes around every fourth year, the Supreme Court announced Monday. The court issued an order setting the arguments for February 29. Governor Rick Scott signed the Legislature's plan to redraw the state's congressional districts on Thursday likely paving the way for more lawsuits surrounding the once—a—decade redistricting process.

#### The Budget

The Florida Senate unveiled its budget late in week five after the House had already passed their budget. During week six, the Senate Budget Committee met in a lengthy meeting and unanimously signed off on their nearly \$70.8 billion budget proposal at an eight-hour meeting held on Wednesday, February 15. Budget Committee Chairman JD Alexander (R – Lakes Wales) has scheduled the first floor discussion of the budget for February 23.

The Senate budget spends more money and spares more state jobs than the House plan. The Senate budget would eliminate about 4,000 state jobs, some of which are vacant, which is a reduction of nearly 3.3

percent. It would also shift nearly half a billion dollars from state trust funds into general revenue, including \$265 million from the \$739 million Lawton Chiles Endowment, After the Senate debates their budget and passes it out, the budget typically goes to joint conference committees to hammer out the differences. Both chambers' budgets follow the pattern outlined by Governor Rick Scott which centers on freeing up money for education. The biggest differences between the chambers' proposals occur in health care and transportation. The Senate panel quelled early tensions over planned cuts to universities and unanimously signed off on the budget proposal at an eight-hour meeting on Wednesday.

#### **Taxes**

Tax cuts and exemptions for Florida businesses totaling \$121 million annually passed the House on Wednesday over controversy by a 93-22 vote. Governor Rick Scott pushed for the main tax cut included in the bill, HB 7087, which increases the corporate income tax exemption from \$25,000 to \$50,000, reducing the number of businesses paying the tax. Lawmakers increased the exemption from \$5,000 to \$25,000 last year. The other provisions in the bill provide incentives for investment in machinery and equipment for manufacturers and increase or expand sales tax exemption for electricity in packinghouses and equipment bought for the production of airplanes and gas turbines.

The House also passed **CS/HB 737** enacting a sales tax holiday on back–to–school items on August 3–5. The sales tax holiday proved less controversial passing by a 115–0 vote. It will cost the state \$26 million and local governments \$6 million.

The following is a breakdown of the issues as of the end of week six:

### Local Bids and Contracts for Public Works

**HB 825** by McBurney; **SB 1186** by Hays

The number one legislative priority for UUCF this session remains bottled up in the original committees of reference. The bills, **HB 825** by Representative Charles McBurney (R – Jacksonville) and **SB 1186** by Senator Alan Hays (R – Umatilla) have never had a hearing this session. This has not deterred our House sponsor who continues to work on the issue. He is currently working with another House member to see if his proposal can be amended onto another bill. The bill he seeks to amend is currently in the House State Affairs Committee which has two meetings scheduled for week seven. The bills would amend Florida Statute 255.20 and remove one of the exceptions allowing local governments to selfperform if they hold a public hearing and determine it is in the public's best interest to perform the project using its own employees.

### Residential Construction Warranties

CS/HB 1013 by Artiles; CS/CS/SB 1196 by Bennett

This legislation provides legislative intent and would apply retroactively. It prohibits a cause of action in law or equity based upon the doctrine of implied warranty of fitness and merchantability or habitability for off–site improvements with exceptions.

**STATUS:** The House Bill is on the House Calendar. The Senate Bill has one more committee reference.

**CS/HB 1059** by Perry; **SB 1610** by Dean

These bills were an attempt to create a statewide identification system for contractors and their employees working on school projects, an issue that continues to be a problem for contractors who cannot seem to get county school board to recognize background checks from another county despite requirements of Florida law.

**STATUS:** The House and Senate Bills each have one more committee reference.

## Hiring, Leasing or Obtaining Personal Property or Equipment with Intent to Defraud CS/CS/HB 729 by Pilon; CS/SB 1276 by Latvala

These bills amend, expand and strengthen the criminal fraud provisions for failure to return rental property when due.

**STATUS:** The House Bill is on second reading in the House, and the Senate Bill has two more committee references.

### Miami-Dade Lake Belt Mitigation

CS/HB 377 by Nunez; CS/CS/SB 182 by Garcia

This legislation makes technical changes and upgrades to the Lake Belt Mitigation Plan establishing mitigation fees at \$.45 per ton for lime rock and sand mined in the area specifically to fund seepage mitigation projects as approved by the Miami–Dade Lake Belt Mitigation Committee.

**STATUS:** The House Bill was received by the Senate in messages, and the Senate Bill has one more committee reference.

### Department of Business & Professional Regulation

CS/HB 517 by Grant; CS/SB
762 by Hays (Streamlining)
HB 693 by Ingram; SB 1120 by
Jones (Inactive Licenses)
CS/CS/HB 887 by Ingram;
CS/SB 1252 by Jones (Local
Contractor Grandfathering)
The bills referenced above are all
related to DBPR and contain various
provisions affecting industries
regulated by that Department. With
respect to construction, the bills
would propose the following:

**Streamlining legislation** – These bills would reduce the number of continuing education (CE) hours for reactivation of an inactive license. Current statute requires all CE for the inactive period to be completed. The change would require only one renewal cycle of CE for reactivation.

**STATUS:** The House Bill has been received by the Senate in messages, and the Senate Bill has one more committee reference.

#### **Inactive Licenses - HB 693** is

a simple bill which eliminates an existing requirement that an inactive licensee who activates a license cannot go back to inactive status until the licensee has completed one full cycle of active status. For contractors, this would be a two-year period. The Jones' bill is a large department package relating to various professions which also contains this one provision which would affect contractors.

**STATUS:** The House Bill has been received by the Senate in messages, and the Senate Bill has two more committee references.

### **Local Contractor Grandfathering** – This

Department bill includes provisions which 1) waive initial licensure fees for veterans who apply for licensure within 24 months of an honorable discharge; 2) will allow the Department to approve continuing education courses and

only send problem applications to the board for review; 3) will allow the Department to reinstate a license that is void if the licensee can demonstrate illness or economic hardship as the cause for non-renewal: 4) will allow the Department to use e-mail to notify a licensee of renewal or expiration of a license and requires the licensee to be responsible for notifying the Department of e-mail address changes; 5) reinstates grandfathering provisions which expired in 2005 for a two-year period ending November 1, 2014 which would allow registered contractors who meet all requirements for licensure to convert to a certified state contractor's license. The Construction Coalition voted to unanimously support this legislation that will allow DBPR staff to routinely approve continuing education courses with appeal to the CILB.

**STATUS:** The House Bill is on second reading on the House Calendar, and the Senate Bill has two more committee references.

### **Electronic Filing of Construction Plans**

CS/HB 387 by Ahern; CS/CS/SB 600 by Bennett

These bills provide for construction plans, drawings and documents to be electronically signed and sealed by licensee and electronically transmitted to the building code administrator or building official for approval.

**STATUS:** The House Bill is in messages to the Senate, and the Senate Bill is in messages to the House.

### Florida Building Code CS/HB 651 by Davis; CS/CS/SB 704 by Bennett

This year's code bills include a variety of provisions for the industry as well as provisions for electronic filing of construction plans contained

in the stand-alone bills referenced above. However, Senator Bennett has loaded the Senate Bill up with controversial amendments including the owner-solar installation amendment mentioned in the above bills, scope of work language for plumbing contractors which opens old wounds between the plumbing and underground utility contracting industry and another which completely repeals the Glass and Glazing Contractor license enacted last year. The House Bill does not contain any of these controversial provisions.

**STATUS:** The House and Senate bills each have one more committee reference.

#### **Public-Private Partnerships**

HB 337 by T. Williams; CS/SB 576 by Bennett The bills create the Florida Public-Private Partnership Act and provide a guideline in establishing public private partnerships. Public-private partnerships are contractual arrangements between public and private sector entities in which the private sector is involved in multiple elements of public infrastructure projects. The bills provide a framework to encourage flexible public-private partnerships in which local government retains

### Certified Contractor License Renewal Reminder

Just a reminder that the Certified Contractor licenses from the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) are up for renewal on August 31, 2012. Current law requires licenseholders to obtain 14 hours of continuing education with at least one hour in workplace safety, one hour in workers' compensation, one hour in business practices, one hour in the advance building code module, one hour in laws and rules (Chapter 489) and one hour in wind mitigation (this requirement only affects general, residential, building, roofing and glass and glazing contractors).

Don't forget to notify the DBPR office of any address change. Section 489.124(2) gives sole responsibility to the licensee for notifying DBPR in writing of the licensee's current mailing address and phone number.

Failure to notify the department of a change of address shall constitute a violation of this section. In addition, if your address changes and you do not notify the department, you may not receive important mailings from the department such as your renewal notice.

### President's Message



You know that Easy **Button Staples has?** You push down on the button and you hear a voice say

"That was easy." Well, I could have used a truck load of those easy buttons in Tallahassee on January 31 while trying to push important legislative issues in the House and Senate. Every year UUCF has a legislative summit in Tallahassee during session and members from all over the state meet with their legislators to tell them why our issues are important and how passing that legislation will have a positive impact on the underground utility industry. Before I go any further, I want to thank all of those who attended this year's summit. I hope you all attend again next year and bring a first



timer with you. The legislative issue we focused most intently on was the Competitive Bid bill. Cities and counties around the

state are installing underground utilities with their own forces. In essence, we are competing with the public sector during a time in which our industry is suffering terribly from this poor economy resulting in the denial of job opportunities in the private sector. While many cities and counties are protecting their own employees by performing work that the private sector depends on for survival,

the tax payers are being hurt by inefficient government. They are refusing to trim government by eliminating unneeded public sector jobs and stealing our work to justify it. That is not in the "public's best interest." The Competitive Bid bill - HB 825 by Representative McBurney and SB 1186 by Senator Hays – simply strikes paragraph nine in Florida Statute 255.20 that provides a caveat which allows cities and counties to perform work at any value if it is, according to the opinion of the municipality, in the "public's best interest." Passing this bill still allows municipalities to perform work that is considered maintenance and repair along with projects that are valued at \$300,000 or less. While we were

in Tallahassee, Representative McBurney spoke to the UUCF Board of Directors and shared his appreciation for supporting his bill. We too thanked Representative McBurney for pushing this bill on behalf of UUCF.





This past week, all the stakeholders sat down and resolved all outstanding issues. The result was a 44 page "strike all" amendment which was approved by the House Judiciary Committee. Bruce Kershner, UUCF Executive Vice President, was successful in getting a provision included which addresses public bid opening. Many local governments are misinterpreting the intent of a bill passed last year dealing with design build projects. The provision requires local governments to open sealed bids for public construction at a designated date and time and announce at the meeting the names of each bidder and the price submitted. It also requires that the information be made available upon request. A quick

summary of what is now in the bill is as follows:

#### Changes to s. 255.05

 Insures that hard bids on public projects will be opened in a public setting. At a minimum,





the governmental entity must read out the names of the bidders and total bid amount. The information must be available to anyone making an inquiry.

### **Changes to Chapter 489**

 Reinstates grandfathering provisions for local registered contractors who would like to be state certified – providing until November 1, 2015 for those contractors to apply to the CILB.

**STATUS:** The House Bill is on the House Calendar. The Senate Bill has one last committee reference.

### Effective Public Notice CS/CS/HB 937 by Workman; CS/SB 292 by Bennett

These bills, which deal with electronic notice and publication of legal notices, invitations to bid, etc., are moving. Although the bills are not identical, they have now been linked as similar in the bill tracking system.

**STATUS:** The House and Senate bills each have one last committee reference.

### Regulation of Septic Tanks CS/CS/HB 999 by Dorworth; CS/CS/SB 820 by Dean

These bills repeal statewide septic tank regulation by the Department of Health and replace it with local regulation and specific requirements for areas with first magnitude springs.

**STATUS:** The House Bill is on the House Calendar, and the Senate Bill has one more committee reference.

some cases.


