UUCF Schedules President's Cup Golf Tournament

ome and enjoy three wonderful days and two nights at PGA National Resort & Spa in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida on September 27–29. You will enjoy three fun-filled days of golfing on three different 18 hole courses. Participants will have the opportunity to play on the Squire Course on Friday, Champion Course on Saturday and Palmer Course on Sunday. A different tournament will be held on each course. The format will be a two-man scramble, two-man best ball and two-man alternate shot. All tournaments will be handicapped so everyone will have an equal opportunity to win.

Mike Woodall with John Woody, Inc. is chairing this year's tournament. A portion of the proceeds from this year's tournament will benefit the

UUCF Legal Defense Fund.

Squire Course - Named after the immortal Gene Sarazen, the first golfer ever to win the professional Grand Slam, "the thinking man's course" is the ultimate test of accuracy and precision. Designed by Tom and George Fazio, the Squire is the shortest and most exacting of the courses at PGA National. Accuracy with fairway woods and long irons is tested on many tees, and the new smaller "Emerald Bermuda" greens demand precise approach shots. Several doglegs provide a risk/reward opportunity for any longer hitter as well. The Squire is surrounded by natural areas teeming with vegetation and wildlife - the 5th hole even runs along part of a wilderness preserve, which borders the west side of the PGA

National community.

Last renovated: Fall 2012 (new turf, rebuilt bunkers, expanded tee and green complexes).

Champion Course – Originally designed by Tom and George Fazio for major tournament play, the Champion course at PGA National Resort & Spa was redesigned by Jack Nicklaus in 1990 and now hosts the Honda Classic each spring on the PGA TOUR. Although the Champion has generous landing areas and spacious and accepting TifEagle greens, golfers are presented with course management challenges throughout the round. This South Florida golf resort course has five sets of tees to make the

course more playable for golfers of all levels. A must-play on any avid golfer's list, the Champion features the Bear Trap, which spans three demanding holes designed by Jack Nicklaus

Last renovated: Fall 2012 (new turf, rebuilt bunkers, expanded tee and green complexes).

Palmer Course - Named after its designer. Arnold Palmer, this course is one of the more forgiving at PGA National from tee to fairway, known as a risk/reward game. The open fairways and larger "Champion Bermuda" greens can be quite accommodating and invite players to take a chance if they dare – as golfers are not overly penalized for missing the fairway or primary rough on most holes here. There is a considerable amount of undulation through the fairway, presenting the opportunity for uneven lies and creative shot-making. The Palmer has a great series of finishing holes, with the 18th being one of the most scenic par 5s on the property.

This year, UUCF will be offering individuals a choice in the location of their sleeping accommodations in either the Resort or Cottage Quads. The Resort rooms feature two double beds. The Cottage Quads feature two rooms each with double beds on each side of a living room, dining room and kitchen. Register prior to June 1, 2013, you'll received a \$50.00 per person discount, and we won't send you an invoice until June 1, 2013. The cost is as follows:

Registration received in UUCF Office on or before May 31, 2013

Resort Room – \$598.40 (per person based on double occupancy) Cottage Quads – \$560.40 (per person based on quad occupancy)

Also, two man teams that register now for the golf tournament can delay payment until after June 1, 2013.

The entry fee includes three rounds of golf for the tournament, two nights' accommodation, breakfast on Saturday and Sunday, two \$30.00 vouchers good for dinner on Saturday and Sunday night, one free mulligan for each day (option to purchase additional mulligans will be available), skins game on Friday and Saturday and beverages on the course during tournament play. A Hospitality Suite will be available for your enjoyment.

UUCF is also selling the Survival Kit. Included in the package are: **Friday:** three mulligans, putting contest and ball in the circle contest; **Saturday:** three mulligans, two throws, putting contest and ball in the circle contest; and **Sunday:** three mulligans, two throws, putting contest and ball in the circle contest. If the above items were purchased separately, it would cost \$170.00. However, for golfers who purchase the Survival Kit prior to the first day of the tournament, the cost is only \$160.00. Golfers may also participate in the optional skins game on Sunday at a cost of \$50.00 per team.

There will be great prizes (first and second place each day), optional purchase of the skins game on Sunday and a lot of fun. There will also be prizes for Longest Drive and Closest to the Pin. We will also be holding a putting contest each day.

The tournament is open to the first 60 teams. Hurry and mail your entry fee along with the registration

Sunshine 811 No Bull Rodeo Challenge

There's no bull about it! Enter Sunshine 811's No Bull Rodeo Challenge, and you could be one of eight selected to represent Florida at the July 25–27, 2013, International Locate Rodeo in Athens, GA plus a \$300 cash prize and up to \$1,000 in travel costs.

Deadline: June 3, 2013

What is the No Bull Rodeo Challenge?

It's a rodeo without a bull, but does require a little writing to answer the question: "Explain why your performance represents excellence in locating and damage prevention and why you would best represent Florida's locating community at the International Locate Rodeo?"

Who can enter?

Underground utility/facility locators in Florida. You must be employed by a Sunshine 811 member or one of its locate contractors, or an owner/employee of a private locating company that is an associate member of Sunshine 811. Entrants must meet the following top performers criteria:

- Damages Zero at fault damages for 90 days preceding the date you enter the No Bull Rodeo Challenge. A liable damage is defined as a damage due to an error or omission by the locate technician. Note: This to be determined by the individual company and/or utility owner operator.
- Safety Zero safety violations for 90 days preceding the date you enter the No Bull Rodeo Challenge. Each company should use discretion in this area

How will winners be determined?



After receiving a competitor's entry AND his/her supervisor's form prior to the due date, Sunshine 811 forms a selection committee. Entries are given to the committee with all identifying information omitted. Note: Competitors and their supervisors should be specific when answering the essay question.

What are the divisions?

Two winners will be selected from each of the following divisions: power, gas, water, telecommunications.

What do the winners receive?

Each No Bull Rodeo Challenge winner receives:

- \$300 cash prize
- Plague and team shirt
- A chance to win more during the International Locate Rodeo (ILR)
- Up to \$1,000 in travel costs to the ILR, reimbursable per Sunshine 811's Travel Policy

What is the International Locate Rodeo (ILR)?

The ILR is the premiere event for

utlity locate technicians and serves as the cornerstone to promote high quality and achievable industry standards. In its tenth year, the ILR is scheduled for July 25–27, 2013 at University of Georgia campus.

How do I enter?

Entry involves two steps.

- An authorized company representative nominates one or more locators by completing the **Supervisor's Entry Form** for each competitor.
- 2. The competitor completes the **Competitor Entry Form**.

Note: All No Bull Rodeo Challenge winners travel to and participate in events associated with the International Locate Rodeo at their own risk and must release Sunshine 811 of any liability due to participation in that event. Winners will be required to sign a liability release.










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UUCF/Andrew Scott Johnson Memorial Scholarship Foundation Scholarship Application Available

Current law requires licenseholders to obtain 14 hours of continuing education with at least one hour in workplace safety, one hour in workers' compensation, one hour in business practices, one hour in the advance building code module, one hour in laws and rules (Chapter 489) and one hour in wind mitigation (this requirement only affects general, residential, building, roofing and glass and glazing contractors).

Don't forget to notify the DBPR office of any address change. Section 489.124(2) gives sole responsibility to the licensee for notifying DBPR in writing of the licensee's current mailing address and phone number.

Failure to notify the department of a change of address shall constitute a violation of this section. In addition, if your address changes and you do not notify the department, you may not receive important mailings from the department such as your renewal notice.

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President's Message



"IS IT IN THE BID?"

As the year draws closer to an end and the

full implementation of Obamacare becomes an inevitable reality in 2014, now is the time you must start considering what you will do as an employer. Many of us build projects that last several months. In some cases, our projects last well over a year. The problem contractors will face this year is how to bid projects that start in 2013 but finish in 2014. Current labor rates and overhead include the cost of health care premiums paid by the employer in 2013. However, those premiums will not be applicable after your health



care renewal in 2014. Therefore, the job you bid in 2013 that carries over into 2014 will not have all the additional costs the 2014

health care renewal will impose. Contractors bidding jobs in October, November and December of this year must anticipate what their 2014 health care costs will be. They must then incorporate those costs in their 2013 bids so those costs can be recovered in 2014. It is a reality businesses will have to face but it is imperative that the true costs of health care be included in the cost of doing business.

I suggest that you meet with your insurance agent as soon as possible and start a dialogue regarding the potential increased health insurance premiums coming in 2014. They will be able to provide you with a health care insurance calculator that can approximate your premiums in 2014 so you can include those costs in your bids in 2013 and before it's too late.
