UUCF Schedules President's Cup Golf Tournament

ome and enjoy three wonderful days and two nights at PGA National Resort & Spa in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida on September 27-29. You will enjoy three fun-filled days of golfing on three different 18 hole courses. Participants will have the opportunity to play on the Squire Course on Friday, Champion Course on Saturday and Palmer Course on Sunday. A different tournament will be held on each course. The format will be a two-man scramble. two-man best ball and two-man alternate shot. All tournaments will be handicapped so everyone will have an equal opportunity to win.

Mike Woodall with John Woody, Inc. is chairing this year's tournament. A portion of the proceeds from this year's tournament will benefit the UUCF Legal Defense Fund.

This year, UUCF will be offering individuals a choice in the location of their sleeping accommodations in either the Resort or Cottage Quads. The Resort rooms feature two double beds. The Cottage Quads feature two rooms each with double beds on each side of a living room, dining room and kitchen. **Register as soon as possible.** The cost is as follows:

Resort Room – \$598.40 (per person based on double occupancy) Cottage Quads – \$560.40 (per person based on quad occupancy)

Also, two man teams that register now for the golf tournament can delay payment until after June 29, 2013.

The entry fee includes three rounds of golf for the tournament, two nights' accommodation, breakfast on Saturday and Sunday, two \$30.00 vouchers good for dinner on Saturday and Sunday night, one free mulligan for each day (option to purchase additional mulligans will be available), skins game on Friday and Saturday and beverages on the course during tournament play. A Hospitality Suite will be available for your enjoyment.

The three courses are as follows: **Squire Course** – Named after the immortal Gene Sarazen, the first golfer ever to win the professional Grand Slam, "the thinking man's course" is the ultimate test of accuracy and precision. Designed by Tom and George Fazio, the Squire is the shortest and most exacting of the courses at PGA National. Accuracy with fairway woods and long irons is tested on many tees,

and the new smaller "Emerald Bermuda" greens demand precise approach shots. Several doglegs provide a risk/reward opportunity for any longer hitter as well. The Squire is surrounded by natural areas teeming with vegetation and wildlife – the 5th hole even runs along part of a wilderness preserve, which borders the west side of the PGA National community.

Last renovated: Fall 2012 (new turf, rebuilt bunkers, expanded tee and green complexes).

Champion Course – Originally designed by Tom and George Fazio for major tournament play, the Champion course at PGA National Resort & Spa was redesigned by Jack Nicklaus in 1990 and now hosts the Honda Classic each spring





on the PGA TOUR. Although the Champion has generous landing areas and spacious and accepting TifEagle greens, golfers are presented with course management challenges throughout the round. This South Florida golf resort course has five sets of tees to make the course more playable for golfers of all levels. A must–play on any avid golfer's list, the Champion features the Bear Trap, which spans three demanding holes designed by Jack Nicklaus

Last renovated: Fall 2012 (new turf, rebuilt bunkers, expanded tee and green complexes).

Palmer Course - Named after its designer, Arnold Palmer, this course is one of the more forgiving at PGA National from tee to fairway, known as a risk/reward game. The open fairways and larger "Champion Bermuda" greens can be quite accommodating and invite players to take a chance if they dare – as golfers are not overly penalized for missing the fairway or primary rough on most holes here. There is a considerable amount of undulation through the fairway, presenting the opportunity for uneven lies and creative shot-making. The Palmer has a great series of finishing holes, with the 18th being one of the most scenic par 5s on the property.

UUCF is also selling the Survival Kit. Included in the package are: **Friday:** three mulligans, putting contest and

ball in the circle contest; **Saturday:** three mulligans, two throws, putting contest and ball in the circle contest; and **Sunday:** three mulligans, two throws, putting contest and ball in the circle contest. If the above items were purchased separately, it would cost \$170.00. However, for golfers who purchase the Survival Kit prior to the first day of the tournament, the cost is only \$160.00. Golfers may also participate in the optional skins game on Sunday at a cost of \$50.00 per team.

There will be great prizes (first and second place each day), optional purchase of the skins game on Sunday and a lot of fun. There will also be prizes for Longest Drive and Closest to the Pin. We will also be holding a putting contest each day.

The tournament is open to the first 60 teams. Hurry and mail your entry fee along with the registration form as soon as possible. Sleeping accommodations consist of two people per one bedroom (two double beds) or four people (two bedrooms, two double beds) per Cottage Quad.





Ban on Texting While Driving

A fter trying for five years, Florida finally has a law banning texting while driving. *CS/CS/CS/SB 52* by **Senator Nancy Detert** (**R - Venice**) was signed by the governor on May 28, 2013 and became *Chapter 2013–58*, Laws of Florida. But there are plenty of loopholes that give Florida drivers more leeway than in other states. They include:

- texting while driving is only a secondary offense.
- first texting ticket is considered a noncriminal traffic infraction, punishable as a non-moving violation, and comes with \$30 fine.

 new law specifically states a driver's phone records can be used as evidence only if a crash results in a death or injury.

The House tacked on a last-

minute amendment limiting law enforcement's ability to use phone records to identify violations. The sponsor of the amendment, **Representative Jose Oliva (R - Miami Lakes)** a future House speaker, said that limiting police access to motorists' texting records would protect the "civil liberties" of Floridians. This would have the effect of restricting the state's ability to prove whether a violation has occurred. The move stunned

Representative Doug Holder (R – Venice), the House sponsor and Senator Nancy Detert, the Senate measure's sponsor. In the end, both sponsors reluctantly accept Oliva's amendment.

The law also notes "a motor vehicle that is stationary is not being operated" and isn't subject to the ban. This allows for drivers stopped at traffic lights or stuck in traffic to carry on texting. So don't expect the driver in front of you to be ready to go when the light turns green if they're in the middle of a text.

The texting law doesn't go into effect until October 1, 2013.

Registered Contractor License Renewal Reminder

Just a reminder that the Registered Contractor licenses from the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) are up for renewal on August 31, 2013. Current law requires licenseholders to obtain 14 hours of continuing education with at least one hour in workplace safety, one hour in workers' compensation, one hour in business practices, one hour in the advance building code module, one hour in laws and rules (Chapter 489) and one hour in wind mitigation (this requirement only affects general, residential, building, roofing and glass and glazing contractors).

Don't forget to notify the DBPR office of any address change. Section 489.124(2) gives sole responsibility to the licensee for notifying DBPR in writing of the licensee's current mailing address and phone number.

Failure to notify the department of a change of address shall constitute a violation of this section. In addition, if your address changes and you do not notify the department, you may not receive important mailings from the department such as your renewal notice.

OSHA Fact Sheet

Protect Yourself! Workers may be exposed to Brown Recluse Spider

The brown recluse belongs to a group of spiders commonly known as violin spiders or fiddlebacks. The characteristic fiddle—shaped pattern is located on the top of the leg attachment region (cephalothorax). Because they are secluded and withdrawn, as their name implies, the brown recluse avoids open spaces. Brown recluse spiders are dangerous and they can bite and inject toxic venom.

Identification

- Body size: 1/4 to 3/4 inch (6.4–19.1mm)
- Color: Golden brown
- A dark violin/fiddle shape is located located on the top of the leg attachment region (cephalothorax) with the neck of the violin/fiddle pointing backward toward the abdomen.
- Unlike most spiders that have

eight eyes, the brown recluse has six eyes. The eyes, arranged in pairs – one pair in front and a pair on either side – can be readily seen under low magnification.

Habitat

The Brown Recluse Spider builds small retreat webs behind objects of any type.

Symptoms

- The severity of the bite may vary.
 Symptoms may vary from none to very severe.
- The bite generally becomes reddened within several hours.
- There is often a systemic reaction within 24–36 hours characterized by restlessness, fever, chills, nausea, weakness and joint pain.
- Tissue at the site of the bite and the surrounding area dies and eventually sheds.

Protection

 Wear a long-sleeved shirt, hat, gloves, and boots when handling

- stored boxes, firewood, lumber and rocks, etc.
- Inspect and shake out clothing and shoes before getting dressed.
- Use insect repellants, such as DEET or Picaridin, on clothing and footwear.

Treatment

- Clean the bite area with soap and water.
- Apply ice to the bite area to slow absorption of the venom.
- Elevate and immobilize the bitten extremity.
- Capture the spider, if at all possible, for identification purposes.
- Seek medical attention.
