UUCF 2013 Conference Update

nights' accommodation, breakfast on Saturday and Sunday, two \$30.00 vouchers good for dinner on Saturday and Sunday night, one free mulligan for each day (option to purchase additional mulligans will be available), skins game on Friday and Saturday and beverages on the course during tournament play. A Hospitality Suite will be available for your enjoyment.

The three courses are as follows: **Squire Course** – Named after the immortal Gene Sarazen, the first golfer ever to win the professional Grand Slam, "the thinking man's course" is the ultimate test of accuracy and precision. Designed by Tom and George Fazio, the Squire is the shortest and most exacting of the courses at PGA National. Accuracy with fairway woods and long irons is tested on many tees, and the new smaller "Emerald Bermuda" greens demand precise approach shots. Several doglegs provide a risk/reward opportunity for any longer hitter as well. The Squire is surrounded by natural areas teeming with vegetation and wildlife - the 5th hole even runs along part of a wilderness preserve, which borders the west side of the PGA National community.

Last renovated: Fall 2012 (new turf, rebuilt bunkers, expanded tee and green complexes).

Champion Course – Originally designed by Tom and George Fazio for major tournament play, the Champion course at PGA National Resort & Spa was redesigned by Jack Nicklaus in 1990 and now hosts the Honda Classic each spring on the PGA TOUR. Although the Champion has generous landing areas and spacious and accepting TifEagle greens, golfers are presented with course management challenges throughout the round. This South Florida golf resort course

has five sets of tees to make the

course more playable for golfers of all levels. A must-play on any avid golfer's list, the Champion features the Bear Trap, which spans three demanding holes designed by Jack Nicklaus

Last renovated: Fall 2012 (new turf, rebuilt bunkers, expanded tee and green complexes).

Palmer Course - Named after its designer, Arnold Palmer, this course is one of the more forgiving at PGA National from tee to fairway, known as a risk/reward game. The open fairways and larger "Champion Bermuda" greens can be quite accommodating and invite players to take a chance if they dare – as golfers are not overly penalized for missing the fairway or primary rough on most holes here. There is a considerable amount of undulation through the fairway, presenting the opportunity for uneven lies and creative shot-making. The Palmer has a great series of finishing holes, with the 18th being one of the most scenic par 5s on the property.

UUCF is also selling the Survival Kit. Included in the package are: **Friday:** three mulligans, putting contest and ball in the circle contest; **Saturday:** three mulligans, two throws, putting contest and ball in the circle contest; and **Sunday:** three mulligans, two throws, putting contest and ball in the circle contest. If the above items were purchased separately, it would cost \$170.00. However, for golfers who purchase the Survival Kit prior to the first day of the tournament, the cost is only \$160.00. Golfers may also participate in the optional skins game on Sunday at a cost of \$50.00 per team.

There will be great prizes (first and second place each day), optional purchase of the skins game on Sunday and a lot of fun. There will also be prizes for Longest Drive and Closest to the Pin. We will also be holding a putting contest each day.





Registered Contractor License Renewal Reminder

Just a reminder that the Registered Contractor licenses from the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) are up for renewal on August 31, 2013. Current law requires licenseholders to obtain 14 hours of continuing education with at least one hour in workplace safety, one hour in workers' compensation, one hour in business practices, one hour in the advance building code module, one hour in laws and rules (Chapter 489) and one hour in wind mitigation (this requirement only affects general, residential, building, roofing and glass and glazing contractors).

Don't forget to notify the DBPR office of any address change. Section 489.124(2) gives sole responsibility to the licensee for notifying DBPR in writing of the licensee's current mailing address and phone number.

Failure to notify the department of a change of address shall constitute a violation of this section. In addition, if your address changes and you do not notify the department, you may not receive important mailings from the department such as your renewal notice.

A lesson in history.

. . . More history on Boca Raton continued from

the May 2013 issue of the Ditchmen.

1971 – Marymount College is renamed the College of Boca Raton.

1972 – The Boca Raton Historical Society (BRHS) is founded as a project of the Junior Service League.

Concerned voters pass a referendum imposing a 40,000 dwelling-unit "growth cap" to curb the City's expansion. The cap is struck down in Palm Beach County Circuit



Court in 1976 when a judge rules it an arbitrary figure. However, the judge allows the cap to remain until all legal appeals are exhausted.

1979 – The City adopts a land-use plan placing density ceilings on all properties. The plan achieves the goals of the growth cap while the issue is pending in higher courts. In 1980, after spending over \$1,000,000 in appeals to the Florida and U.S. Supreme Courts, the City admits defeat on the growth

1980 - The City Council creates the Community Redevelopment Agency to return economic vitality to the downtown. Its first project is the beautification of Sanborn Square.

1981 – IBM introduces the P.C., designed at its Boca Raton plant, and revolutionizes the personal computer industry.

1982 – City officials lease Town Hall to the BRHS and authorize its restoration. Through state grants and private funding the building is restored by 1984. It is listed on the

HEAT ILLNESS CAN BE DEADLY. Every year, thousands of workers become sick from exposure to heat, and some even die.

These illnesses and deaths are preventable.

Who is affected? What is heat illness? How can heat illness be

prevented?

OSHA's nationwide Heat Illness Prevention Campaign aims to raise awareness and teach workers and employers about the dangers of working in hot weather and provide valuable resources to address these concerns. Begun in 2011, the Heat Illness Prevention Campaign has reached more than 7 million people and distributed close to half a million fact sheets, posters, quick cards, training guides and wallet cards. OSHA is again joining with other federal and state agencies and non-governmental organizations to spread the word about preventing heat illness. For example, OSHA is continuing its partnership with the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's (NOAA) National Weather Service to include worker safety precautions in their Excessive Heat Watch, Warning, and Advisory Products.

National Register of Historic Places.

1985 – BRHS purchases the F.E.C. Railway Station and begins its restoration, completed in 1988. The station is named the Count de Hoernle Pavilion in recognition of a generous donation from the Count and Countess de Hoernle. It is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The BRHS receives the Florida Trust for Historic Preservation Outstanding Achievement Award in the Field of Preservation for the restoration of Town Hall.

1986 – The Art Guild changes its name to the Boca Raton Museum of Art.

1989 – The BRHS receives the Florida Trust for Historic Preservation Outstanding Achievement Award in the Field of Preservation for the restoration of the F.E.C. Railway Station.

1990 – Old Floresta, site of twenty-nine Mizner designed homes, becomes the city's first historic district.

1991 – Mizner Park opens. Its concept is alternative

land use for coastal, urban areas. It includes a concert pavilion, park, apartments, business offices, shop, and restaurants.

After acquiring University status, the College of Boca Raton becomes Lynn University, in honor of its major benefactor.

After 126 years in New York, W.R. Grace & Co. moves to Boca Raton. The firm relocates 250 employees and their families to the City.

1992 - The International Museum of Cartoon Art moves to Mizner Park.

1995 - The state of Florida celebrates its Sesquicentennial.

1996 – The BRHS begins the Great Train Restoration. Four historic rail cars, located at the Train Depot, undergo major exterior restorations.

1997 - Palm Beach County Commissioners vote to designate Camino Real, the Camino Real Bridge, and the Porte Cochere at South Inlet Park as historic sites.

The Boca Raton Historical Society celebrates its 25th anniversary at the grand opening celebration of the Boca Raton Resort & Club's Mizner Center.

1998 – Boca Community Hospital expands again, becoming one of the best in southeast Florida.



the anthrax virus by means of the U.S. mail in the days following the September 11th terrorist attacks.

Florida Atlantic University plays the first football game of their inaugural season on September 1.

2002 – The International Museum of Cartoon Art closes its doors at Mizner Park.

Pearl City, Boca Raton's historic black neighborhood first platted in 1915, is designated as the city's second official Historic District.

Despite community—wide preservation efforts, the ca. 1939 Boca Raton Elementary School gymnasium, long time community center and site of many historic local events, is demolished by the county school board.

2003 – Scandal rocks FAU's fund raising arm, the FAU Foundation, over the gift of a Corvette to departing president Anthony Cantanese.

BRHS, in association with Boca Raton magazine, DCOTA, and DuPont–O'Neil and Associates celebrates the completion of the restoration of two 1947 streamliner rail cars at the F.E.C. Railway Station, Count de Hoernle Pavilion.

2004 – Boca survives two September hurricanes, Frances and Jeanne, the worst storms to hit the areas since the 1960s. Extensive property and landscaping damage and extended power outages cause many businesses and residents serious financial losses.

2005 – Hurricane Katrina causes minor damage to the region en route to its catastrophic strike on the northern Gulf Coast in August. Late bloomer Hurricane Wilma arrives in October, the worst hurricane to strike Boca since 1964's Cleo. Dade, Broward, and Palm Beach Counties suffer widespread and long term power outages and millions of dollars in property damage.

2006 – Preservationists suffer a major setback when T–3, one of the surviving WW2 era buildings adjacent the FAU campus, is consumed by fire immediately after being restored in May.

- (PSAs), drop—in articles about heat illness prevention that you can customize to share and campaign artwork.
- The Fatality map shows locations of outdoor worker, heat-related fatalities between 2008 and 2012. It is not an exhaustive list of all worker fatalities from heat exposure. The map provides a geographic reminder that Water.Rest.Shade. are vital to providing a safe and healthful environment when working outdoors in the heat.

The Heat Illness web page and many resources are available **en español**.

We hope you will join with us in this effort by helping to reach workers and employers in your community with the resources you will find on this site.

Who is affected? Workers exposed to hot and humid conditions are at risk of heat illness, especially those doing heavy work tasks or using bulky protective clothing and equipment. Some workers might be at greater risk than others if they have not built up a tolerance to hot conditions.

What is heat illness? The body normally cools itself by sweating. During hot weather, especially with high humidity, sweating isn't enough. Body temperature can rise to dangerous levels if precautions are not taken. Heat illnesses range from heat rash and heat cramps to heat exhaustion and heat stroke. Heat stroke requires immediate medical attention and can result in death.

How can heat illness be prevented? Remember three simple words: water, rest, shade. Employers should educate their

workers on how drinking water often, taking breaks, and limiting time in the heat can help prevent heat illness. They should include these prevention steps in worksite training and plans. Employers should also teach employees to gradually build up to heavy work in hot conditions because this helps you build tolerance to the heat - or become acclimated. They should take steps that help workers become acclimated, especially workers who are new to working outdoors in the heat or have been away from work for a week or more. Lastly, during the first week of work, employers should gradually increase workloads and allow more frequent breaks. You should plan for an emergency and know what to do - acting quickly can save lives!

Drink water often

Rest in the shade

Report heat symptoms early

Know what to do in an emergency

HEAT SAFETY TOOL [En español]

When you're working in the heat, safety comes first. With the OSHA Heat Safety Tool, you have vital safety information available whenever and wherever you need it – right on your mobile phone.

The App allows workers and supervisors to calculate the heat index for their worksite, and, based on the **heat index**, displays a **risk level** to outdoor workers. Then, with a simple "click," you can get reminders about the **protective measures** that should be taken at

that risk level to protect workers from heat–related illness-reminders about drinking enough fluids, scheduling rest breaks, planning for and knowing what to do in an emergency, adjusting work operations, gradually building up the workload for new workers, training on heat illness signs and symptoms, and monitoring each other for signs and symptoms of heat–related illness.

Stay informed and safe in the heat, check your risk level.

For more information about safety while working in the heat, see OSHA's **heat illness webpage**, including new **online guidance** about using the heat index to protect workers.
