UUCF Schedules President's Cup Golf Tournament

ome and enjoy three wonderful days and two nights at PGA National Resort & Spa in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida on September 27–29. You will enjoy three fun-filled days of golfing on three different 18 hole courses. Participants will have the opportunity to play on the Squire Course on Friday, Champion Course on Saturday and Palmer Course on Sunday. A different tournament will be held on each course. The format will be a two-man scramble, two-man best ball and two-man alternate shot. All tournaments will be handicapped so everyone will have an equal opportunity to win.

Mike Woodall with John Woody, Inc. is chairing this year's tournament. A portion of the proceeds from this year's tournament will benefit the

UUCF Legal Defense Fund.

Squire Course - Named after the immortal Gene Sarazen, the first golfer ever to win the professional Grand Slam, "the thinking man's course" is the ultimate test of accuracy and precision. Designed by Tom and George Fazio, the Squire is the shortest and most exacting of the courses at PGA National. Accuracy with fairway woods and long irons is tested on many tees, and the new smaller "Emerald Bermuda" greens demand precise approach shots. Several doglegs provide a risk/reward opportunity for any longer hitter as well. The Squire is surrounded by natural areas teeming with vegetation and wildlife - the 5th hole even runs along part of a wilderness preserve, which borders the west side of the PGA

National community.

Last renovated: Fall 2012 (new turf, rebuilt bunkers, expanded tee and green complexes).

Champion Course – Originally designed by Tom and George Fazio for major tournament play, the Champion course at PGA National Resort & Spa was redesigned by Jack Nicklaus in 1990 and now hosts the Honda Classic each spring on the PGA TOUR. Although the Champion has generous landing areas and spacious and accepting TifEagle greens, golfers are presented with course management challenges throughout the round. This South Florida golf resort course has five sets of tees to make the

course more playable for golfers of all levels. A must-play on any avid golfer's list, the Champion features the Bear Trap, which spans three demanding holes designed by Jack Nicklaus

Last renovated: Fall 2012 (new turf, rebuilt bunkers, expanded tee and green complexes).

Palmer Course - Named after its designer. Arnold Palmer, this course is one of the more forgiving at PGA National from tee to fairway, known as a risk/reward game. The open fairways and larger "Champion Bermuda" greens can be quite accommodating and invite players to take a chance if they dare – as golfers are not overly penalized for missing the fairway or primary rough on most holes here. There is a considerable amount of undulation through the fairway, presenting the opportunity for uneven lies and creative shot-making. The Palmer has a great series of finishing holes, with the 18th being one of the most scenic par 5s on the property.

This year, UUCF will be offering individuals a choice in the location of their sleeping accommodations in either the Resort or Cottage Quads. The Resort rooms feature two double beds. The Cottage Quads feature two rooms each with double beds on each side of a living room, dining room and kitchen. Register prior to June 1, 2013, you'll received a \$50.00 per person discount, and we won't send you an invoice until June 1, 2013. The cost is as follows:

Resort Room – \$598.40 (per person based on double occupancy) Cottage Quads – \$560.40 (per person based on quad occupancy)

Also, two man teams that register now for the golf tournament can delay payment until after June 1, 2013.

The entry fee includes three rounds of golf for the tournament, two nights' accommodation, breakfast on Saturday and Sunday, two \$30.00 vouchers good for dinner on Saturday and Sunday night, one free mulligan for each day (option to purchase additional mulligans will be available), skins game on Friday and Saturday and beverages on the course during tournament play. A Hospitality Suite will be available for your enjoyment.

UUCF is also selling the Survival Kit. 



Registered Contractor License Renewal Reminder

Just a reminder that the Registered Contractor licenses from the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) are up for renewal on August 31, 2013. Current law requires licenseholders to obtain 14 hours of continuing education with at least one hour in workplace safety, one hour in workers' compensation, one hour in business practices, one hour in the advance building code module, one hour in laws and rules (Chapter 489) and one hour in wind mitigation (this requirement only affects general, residential, building, roofing and glass and glazing contractors).

Don't forget to notify the DBPR office of any address change. Section 489.124(2) gives sole responsibility to the licensee for notifying DBPR in writing of the licensee's current mailing address and phone number.

Failure to notify the department of a change of address shall constitute a violation of this section. In addition, if your address changes and you do not notify the department, you may not receive important mailings from the department such as your renewal notice.

President's Message



A lesson in history.

This year's **UUCF** Conference will

be held in Boca Raton. So. let's review some interesting history.

1895 – Henry Flagler's F.E.C. railroad arrives in Boca Raton and later Miami, opening South Florida to development.

Thomas Rickards, surveyor and engineer, builds the first house on the north shore of Lake Boca Raton. He clears and plats the area for Flagler's Model Land Company.

1904 – Japanese colonists arrive in Boca Raton to farm pineapples on



land purchased from Flagler. The Yamato Colony is formed. The colony numbers 40 by 1908. Later that year a blight destroys

the pineapple crop. By the 1920s most of the colony has left Florida seeking other prospects.

1905 - Boca Raton's first woodplank bridge is built across the Hillsborough River (today's El Rio Canal) to reach land west of town.

1908 - George Long's packing house serves as Boca's first classroom until a one-room

schoolhouse is constructed by the end of the year.

1909 - Palm Beach becomes Florida's newest county.

1913 – Harley and Harriet Gates arrive in Boca Raton and purchase five acres along the canal (today's Intracoastal), naming it Palmetto Park Plantation. The homestead gives its name to the principal eastwest road.

1915 – A telephone line, the Board of Trade and the Power and Light Company bring Boca Raton out of the pioneer era.

1917 – A manually operated







drawbridge on Palmetto Park Road makes the beach easily reached.

1920 – Boca Raton's masonry elementary school opens. Farming is the area's main industry.

1923 – J. C. and Floy Mitchell move to Boca Raton and become successful in real estate during the land boom. J. C. is Mayor from 1939-1949. Later, they lead a drive to build a community church on land donated by Floy's father.

The first bridge at the Boca Raton Inlet is a fixed wooden span.

1925 – The town of Boca Raton is incorporated.

Palm Beach architect, Addison Mizner, arrives in Boca Raton. He hopes to create an entire city with his Development Corporation. He plans to develop a 1600–acre tract of Mediterranean style structures for commercial and residential use.

1926 – Mizner's Cloister Inn opens as a Ritz–Carlton Investment Corporation project. Though his Development Corporation failed within two years, the opening of his hotel sparked a promotional build up that ultimately turned Boca Raton from a sleepy village into a resort community.

1927 – Town Hall, originally designed by Mizner, is not completed as the architect goes bankrupt. Instead, it is scaled down and finished by Delray Beach architect, William Alsmeyer. It houses the volunteer Fire Department and its first engine, "Old Betsy."

Clarence Geist buys the Cloister Inn for \$71,000 at a courthouse door sale assuming \$7 million of the Mizner Development Corporation's debt.

1930 – The first railroad passenger station in Boca Raton is constructed at Geist's request at Camino Real and Dixie Highway. Enlarging the Cloister Inn, Geist creates the private Boca Raton Club. He builds the Cabana Club, south of the inlet, offering 200 private beach cabanas, informal dining rooms and card lounges. The Boca Raton Inlet is dredged for clear passage.

1936 – Boca Raton's first airport is a New Deal WPA project obtained through the efforts of Clarence Geist.

1942 – The U.S. enters WWII. Boca Raton's airport and coastal locale make it ideal for an Army Base. The Army takes over the Boca Raton Club for offices, classrooms, and barracks. The U.S. Government acquires 5,860 acres from more than 100 property owners to construct an air base. The Boca Raton Army Airfield is the air



corp's only radar training school in the U.S. during the war.

1944 – J. Myer Schine buys the Boca Raton Club and the Spanish River Land Company from Geist's estate. The Club reopens as the Boca Raton Hotel and Club in 1945.

1949 – The City buys 2,404 acres of the former airfield. In a contract with the Federal Government, the City agrees to operate a civilian airport west of the El Rio Canal.

1950 – The Art Guild of Boca Raton is established. The group displays art exhibits at the old Town Hall and the Boca Raton Hotel and Club.

1953–Africa U.S.A., a 177–acre park with free–roaming, African animals opens. It closes by 1961 due to an infestation of African red tick. Today, itisthe Camino Gardensneighborhood.

1956 – Arthur Vining Davis, founder of the Aluminum Company of America, purchases the Boca Raton Hotel and

Club. He creates Arvida Development Corporation and sets aesthetic precedence for future commercial and residential development in Boca Raton.

1960 – The State Cabinet approves the construction of the fifth state university, Florida Atlantic University, in Boca Raton. Saint Joan of Arc Catholic School, founded by the Sisters of Mercy, opens.

1961 – Saint Andrew's School, founded by the Episcopal School Foundation, opens.

1962 – Royal Palm Plaza opens as the town's first shopping center. It is affectionately known as "The Pink Plaza."

1963 – The F.E.C. Railway stops passenger service at the train depot. Boca Raton High School opens. Up to now, students have traveled to Seacrest High School in Delray Beach. Marymount College opens as a two-year women's college.

1964 – Florida Atlantic University opens and is dedicated by President Lyndon B. Johnson. The efforts

to establish this school by local resident, Thomas F. Fleming, are recognized with the University's first Distinguished Service Award.

1966 – The International Business Machine Corporation (IBM) buys 550 acres of land from Arvida. In 1967, construction begins on a novel Marcel Brever–Robert Gatje designed facility surrounding a large circular man–made lake. Boca Raton is the birthplace of the IBM PC and home of OS/2 Warp.

1967 – Boca Raton Community Hospital is dedicated. It was built entirely by community money, raised through special events such as the annual Fiesta de Boca Raton.

1969 – Arvida builds the twenty–six story tower at the Boca Raton Hotel.
